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

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

RE: BCWRD/Fox Island Flood Control Project

Dear Mr. Smith,

I am in receipt of your letter dated January 12, 2018. I have asked Mr. Kennelly to review the matter and, after speaking with him about it, this is my response.

To begin, I will give my understanding of the scenario, albeit slightly abbreviated. The Fox Island Subdivision of Burleigh County, North Dakota is in need of flood protection. Originally, the plan was to construct a levee along the western and southern boarders of the Subdivision; however, your clients chose to opt out of the proposed plan. This required the engineers to come up with a new flood protection plan for those homes that did not opt out. Mr. Kennelly spoke with Mr. Marcus Hall, the County Engineer, who told Mr. Kennelly that the new plan is to raise Gallatin Loop and Gallatin Drive by approximately one to one-and-a-half feet. Gallatin Loop and Gallatin Drive are approximately eighty feet wide. The plan would stay within the bounds of those roads. This, he said, would provide the homeowners who did not opt out adequate protection from any flooding that may occur.

You have posed two issues for me to consider. I will take each in turn.

The first issue is essentially whether the proposed raising of Gallatin Loop and Gallatin Drive falls within the dedication language of the Fox Island Subdivision Plat, which states the streets indicated on the Plat are dedicated "to the public use forever." You state that North Dakota law requires that the streets are dedicated for "street purposes." North Dakota law, however, is more broad than that. Ordinarily, "[w]hen the plat has been made out and certified, acknowledged, and recorded as required by sections 40-50.1-01, 40-50.1-03, and 40-50.104, every donation or grant to the public . . . marked or noted as such on the plat or map is a sufficient conveyance to vest the fee simple title in the parcel of land as designated on the plat." N.D.C.C. § 40-50.1-05 (emphasis added). When the land that is granted for "streets, alleys, ways, or other public uses," section 40-50.1-05 prescribes that land "must be held in the corporate name of the jurisdiction in trust for the uses and purposes set forth and expressed and intended." *Id*.

Importantly, this second part does not appear to negate the grant of the land in fee simple, it merely sets forth how the land is to be held and for what purposes it is to be used.

My understanding of this statute is that all land granted to Lincoln Township in the Plat at issue is held in fee simple; however, the statute places a limit on the Township's use of the roadway land to those set forth in the Plat, which dedicated the roadways for "public use forever." This is a broad right of use for the streets in the Fox Island Subdivision and is not limited to merely ingress and egress on the surface of the roads. The land itself is given for public use.

It is my opinion that the roads have been granted in fee simple to the Lincoln Township (pursuant to section 40-50.1-05) and that, even if the Township merely had an easement, the intended flood protection plan still falls within "public use" in two ways. First, the actual route of the roads is not changing. As such, the road way itself is remaining the same and open to public use for ingress and egress. Second, the land dedicated for the roadway is being used for flood protection. Certainly protecting citizens from the damages of flooding is a "public use" of the roadway. The Township will provide this benefit to the public, i.e., the citizens who did not opt out of the original levee plan. Merely because some citizens are not protected cannot negate the fact that the protection is still for public use.

You briefly discuss section 32-15-03.2 as well. It is my position that section 32-15-03.2 does not apply here. This statute states "[n]o transfer to the state of North Dakota or any of its political subdivisions of property for highway purposes shall be deemed to include any interest greater than an easement." However, this section falls within the eminent domain chapter of the Century Code. Section 32-15-03 provides the various estates that may be taken for eminent domain purposes. Reading Chapter 32-15 as a whole, section 32-15-03.2 provides a limit on what the State may take when exercising eminent domain for highway purposes, specifically, that the State acquires no more than an easement over land for highways purposes when it has acquired such land after exercising its eminent domain powers. I have reviewed the Plat and there is no indication that the Fox Island Subdivision roadway system was from an exercise of eminent domain. As such, section 32-15-03.2 does not prohibit the Township from having acquired more than an easement over Gallatin Loop and Gallatin Drive.

The second issue you present is whether Lincoln Township must expand the alleged easement. It is my position that Lincoln Township does not need to expand the purported easement because, as discussed above, the Township does not have an easement over the roads, but owns the road in fee simple, subject to the statutory limitations. Even if the Plat dedication is construed as an easement, so long as the work is done within the bounds of the roadway, no expansion of the easement is necessary. As discussed above, this is because the raising of the road would still be for "public use."

The Burleigh County Water Resource District (BCWRD) is in receipt of a copy of the North Dakota Sovereign Lands permit approval and understands the USACE approved the Section 404 permit for the proposed bank stabilization on Lot 8 Block 1, Valcor Subdivision. The proposed project is to be completed within an easement held by the BCWRD that was obtained for the purposes of constructing, operating and maintaining the federal bank stabilization projects authorized under *Public Law 93-251*, *Water Resources Development Act of 1974*, Section 32 "Streambank Erosion Control Evaluation and Demonstration Act 1974," as amended by the Water Resources Development Act of 1976, Section 161.

The USACE's stated in an undated letter that the County as project sponsor concurred with the project under Section 408. The Burleigh County Planning Department, who provided a letter on this matter to you, dated December 6, is not the project sponsor and has no jurisdictional authority over maintenance of these federal structures. While the North Dakota State Water Commission (SWC) was the state sponsor, the BCWRD is the local sponsor for the Section 32 revetments. Subsequently, by agreement with the SWC the BCWRD is obligated for a portion of the Operation and Maintenance of these installations, and must preserve the rights obtained under the easement. It is requested, via a copy of this letter, that the USACE provide a correction letter regarding the Section 408 approval noting the BCWRD's concurrence. Based on the BCWRD's review by Board action they authorize the proposed bank stabilization subject to the following conditions:

- 1. No obstructions may be placed within the easement limits that would restrict access to the bank line and Section 32 project features including, but not limited to, decks, sheds or other structural features. This to comply with purpose for easement, previously modified to the 100-foot dimension by the BCWRD as illustrated on the Valcor Subdivision Plat, see Exhibit A.
- 2. Any building permit application on this lot shall include a lot certificate documenting the location of any proposed structures, all which must be outside easement, based on a minimum setback distance of 100 feet from the top of back, at the time of construction. The approximate easement line is noted on **Exhibit B** for illustrative purposes as this not a surveyed location. If the project as constructed results in relocating the upper bank, then the easement shall extend from the new top of bank location.

- 3. Modifications to the existing Section 32 revetment structure, identified as 1322.3 HP, shall be limited to the addition of rock rip rap materials for maintenance purposes only, and it may not be extended further into the river.
- 4. Owner shall allow pedestrian access to BCWRD representatives across the non-easement portion of their lot for the purposes of observing project implementation and future review of bank line conditions.
- 5. Contractor shall notify the BCWRD when construction is to be completed to allow for site inspections prior to, during and after construction.
- 6. The Burleigh County Floodplain Coordinator shall issue a floodplain development permit, as required under the National Flood Insurance Program. This requirement was verified via contact with the North Dakota State Floodplain Coordinator and is reference in Chapter 44 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 60.3. In compliance with this requirement the BCWRD has determined that this project is located within the Missouri River floodplain and east of (outside) the existing floodway, see Exhibit C. Therefore, the proposed fill materials, based on location and as illustrated in the project sketches will not result in adverse impacts to the floodplain and the permit should be approved. To facilitate this process the Board has enclosed a nearly completed Floodplain

 Development Permit Application Non-Building Situation for your use. Several items remained to be filled in so please complete these and send to the Burleigh County Floodplain Coordinator for processing.

RE: APPLICATIONS TO THE STATE ENGINEER FOR AUTHORIZATION TO CONSTRUCT A PROJECT WITHIN ISLANDS AND BEDS OF NAVIGABLE STREAMS OR WATERS OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA.

U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Yankton, South Dakota, Applicant, Application No. S-2021-B

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps), Yankton, South Dakota has filed an application with the State Engineer to place the Corps "Area Closed" and the State Engineer's "No Trespassing" signs on piping plover and least tern nesting areas (islands/sandbars) on the Missouri River between river-mile 1283.0 south of Bismarck and river-mile 1381.0 south of the Garrison Dam for the 2018, 2019, and 2020 nesting seasons.

There are potentially more than 20 sites (islands/sandbars) on the Missouri River that could be signed in Burleigh, Morton, Oliver, Mercer, McLean, and Emmons Counties. Only islands/sandbars with active nests would be signed. The Corps would sign only that portion of any given island/sandbar being used for nesting and rearing by piping plovers and/or least terns. The Corps could sign the entire island/sandbar only if it is determined to be necessary for nest and chick survival.

The Corps would not place the State Engineer's "No Trespassing" signs on any islands/sandbars within the Bismarck-Mandan corridor of the Missouri River between river-miles 1310.0 and 1320.0. The Corps would remove all signs from any given island/sandbar once any hatched chicks have fledged or it has been determined that all nesting attempts have failed. The Corps would provide a map showing the locations of the areas posted to the State Engineer by July 15, of each year in which signage would occur. This authorization would be good for the 2018, 2019, and 2020 nesting seasons only and a new authorization would be required of the Corps for the 2021 nesting season and beyond.

Projects which lie either partially or wholly below the ordinary high watermark of navigable streams or waters may require authorization from the State Engineer prior to construction or operation. At the discretion of the State Engineer, a public meeting may be held on the project for the purpose of gathering information. The State Engineer will consider riparian owner's rights, recreation, navigation, aesthetics, erosion, wildlife, water quality, maintenance of existing water flows, alternative uses, and the environment in determining whether to grant the authorization.

To ensure that all environmental, economic and social factors are considered in the evaluation of this application, your views and comments are solicited. It is requested that any comments or information be forwarded within 30 days of the date of this mailing to the State Engineer, at 900 East Boulevard Avenue, Bismarck, North Dakota. If no reply is received within the 30 days, it will be assumed that your agency has no comment on this project.

Tasks Completed:

- Continued landowner negotiations with Ness and Brown along with additional landscape architectural services and renderings to assist with securing the easements. The Brown's were provided with a claim's release to review, which we understand they are ready to sign.
- Temporary construction easement letters were mailed after Burleigh County Commission reaffirmed funding after states attorney's opinion. The rate of return on these documents has been very slow, meaning the cost to procure will increase. Additional letters to follow to notify those who elected not to participate relative to the status.
- Responded to landowner calls regarding project development and implementation.
- Continued final design, QA/QC process and project manual nearly complete
- Prepared for and facilitated public informational meeting to respond to questions and address to
 the extent possible the South Gallatin Drive landowners reroute alternative. Their petition will
 result executive sessions, due to the potential legal action that may result, therefore there will
 continue to extend time and costs incurred, which will be borne by the project. These costs are
 noted separately below as they are outside our scope of services.
- Submittal to North Dakota State Engineer delayed by Township Easement, which remains to be resolved by the County Commission.
- USACE Section 408 submittal to proceed without easements


Comments and Issues:

- Securing landowner easements continues to absorb considerable and time consuming during design and have increased design costs. It also has delayed the permit application to the ND State Engineer. We anticipate another change in budget to address ongoing issues associated with the temporary construction easements.
- The petition filing with the County Commission regarding the reroute has resulted in the need to consider the impact and response. A reconsideration of the opt-out determination was completed, along with a review of the project options and the older petitions from project inception. These costs are outside the scope of our contract and time is invoiced separately as noted below.
- ➤ USACE Section 408 may result in the need to complete an Environmental Assessment. Submittal to the USACE remains to be completed, but is pending.
- > Bidding early in 2018 is an objective, though permit review needs to be considered before advertising. The 2018 construction window is becoming a concern if delays continue.
- > Final negotiations with residents continues with one landowner easement remaining.
