FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF MCDOWELL DAM BANK STABILIZATION 2024 PROJECT BISMARCK, NORTH DAKOTA

The Burleigh County Water Resource District, Bismarck, North Dakota, invites and will receive quotations for the furnishing of all transportation, labor, materials, tools, equipment, services, permits, utilities, and other items necessary to construct the McDowell Dam Bank Stabilization 2024 Project, in accordance with the attached drawings and contract documents.

Quotations shall conform to and be responsive to the Contract Documents for the work. The Contract Documents will be provided digitally in the form of .pdf files. Quotations shall be provided to the Burleigh County Water Resources District on or before June 10, 2025. Quotations may be submitted by email to the Burleigh County Water Resources District at bcwrd@midco.net or submitted by mail in a sealed envelope to Houston Engineering, Inc at 3712 Lockport Street, Bismarck, ND 58503.

The scope of work consists of work items including but not limited to: Mobilization; Clearing & Grubbing; Geotextile Fabric and Riprap; Topsoil Stripping; Seeding; Erosion Control; Trail Closure Barricades; Trail Restoration; and Safety Fence plus other associated and incidental items.

Should the Owner choose to accept a proposal, the Bidder shall furnish payment and performance bonds as required by the Contract Documents, and the Bidder shall within ten (10) days after Notice of Award execute a contract in accordance with the terms of the bid and contractor's performance and payment bonds as required by law and the regulations and determinations of the Burleigh County Water Resource District. All quotation prices shall be valid for a minimum of 30 days from the date of receipt by the Engineer.

All prospective Contractors shall hold a valid North Dakota Contractor's license of the proper class and shall provide a copy of the license or Certificate of Renewal of the license with the proposal form. The Contractor shall

I. INFORMATION TO BIDDERS

A. BID PROCEDURES

- 1. Burleigh County Water Resource District hereafter called the "Owner", will receive bids on the attached proposal form. All blanks on the proposal must be appropriately filled in and left attached to the project manual. The bid must be properly executed, signed and placed in an envelope addressed to "Burleigh County Water Resource District" and designated as "McDowell Dam Bank Stabilization 2024 Project, Bismarck, North Dakota" or transmitted via email to the Burleigh County Water Resources District at bcwrd@midco.net.
- 2. The Bidders shall <u>acknowledge receipt of all addenda on both the outside of the envelope and on the appropriate blanks on the proposal documents. Mailed bids shall be received at the office of Houston Engineering, Inc. at 3712 Lockport Street, Bismarck ND by **June 10th**, 2025 at 11:00 A.M. local time, at which time the bids will be opened and read aloud.</u>
- 3. Each bidder shall enclose a copy of their North Dakota Contractors license or certificate of renewal thereof issued by the Secretary of State as required by Section 43-07-12 if the North Dakota Century Code as amended. All bids must be upon the basis of cash payment for the work and materials.
- 4. The Owner reserves the right to reject any and all bids, to waive any irregularities and to hold all bids for a period not exceeding thirty (30) calendar days after the date of bid opening.
- 5. Houston Engineering, Inc. 3712 Lockport Street, Bismarck, ND 58503, will furnish any prospective Bidder a .pdf copy of such Plans and Specifications at no cost via email, or physical copies following receipt of payment of Forty dollars (\$40.00), NON-REFUNDABLE, or each set of documents requested, or a CD may be obtained with the documents in electronic (.pdf) format following a receipt of payment of Twenty Five dollars (\$25.00), NON-REFUNDABLE.
- 6. Bidders shall satisfy themselves as to the nature of the material to be handled and the local conditions affecting the work, and if conditions are found to be different than anticipated by the Contractor subsequent to the signing of the Agreement, it shall not in any way relieve the Contractor from its obligation or any risks from the fulfillment of all the work and terms of the contract.
- 8. It will be the responsibility for prospective bidders to visit the site and familiarize themselves with the scope and extent of the work. Failure to visit the site or any site conditions which could reasonably have been determined by examination of the site shall not constitute basis for any claim.



B. AGREEMENT AND DOCUMENTS POST BID

- 1. The bidder to whom the work is awarded will be required to enter into an Agreement and with the requirement for performance bond, payment bond, certificates of insurance, and Workforce Safety & Insurance Premium Payment Certificate. Said documents shall be delivered to the Consulting Engineer within ten (10) calendar days from the date when Notice of Award is delivered to the Bidder.
- 2. The Owner, upon receipt of the above described documents and Form of Agreement and all other necessary paperwork signed by the party of whom the Agreement was awarded; and after approval of all permits required, shall sign this Agreement. After receipt of said items and approval of permits, the Consulting Engineer shall issue a Notice to Proceed. The Contractor shall have until October 1st, 2025, to complete all Work. The date of commencement shall begin when the Notice to Proceed is issued. Any requests for additional time shall be submitted to the Engineer in accordance with the City of Bismarck Construction Specifications for Municipal Public Works Improvements, January 2024 in Section 104-9. If construction is unfinished by the completion date or any authorized extension thereof, the Contractor will be subject to liquidated damages as specified in the City of Bismarck Construction Specifications for Municipal Public Works Improvements, January 2024 in Section 106-3.



II. GENERAL CONDITIONS

- A. The work shall be performed in accordance with the City of Bismarck Construction Specifications for Municipal Public Works Improvements, January 2024 as supplemented and/or modified by the enclosed Project Special Provisions. It shall be necessary for the Contractor to reference materials in the said specifications not included herein.
- B. The enclosed Project Special Provisions, the City of Bismarck Construction Specifications for Municipal Public Works Improvements, January 2024, the Construction Plans and all supplementary documents are essential parts of the Contract, and a requirement occurring in one is as binding as though occurring in all. They are intended to be complementary and to describe and provide for a complete project. Anything in the Specifications and not on the Plans, or on the Plans and not in the Specifications, shall be as though shown or mentioned in both. In case of discrepancy, calculated dimensions will govern over scaled dimensions. In case of discrepancy between plans and specifications, the plans will govern.
- C. The Contractor shall take no advantage of any apparent error or omission in the Plans or Specifications. In the event the Contractor discovers such an error or omission, the Contractor shall immediately notify Engineer. The Engineer will then make such corrections and interpretations as may be necessary for fulfilling the intent of the Plans and Specifications.
- D. The Contractor will be supplied with a minimum of two sets of approved plans and contract assemblies including Project Special Provisions, one set of which the Contractor shall keep available on the work site at all times.
- E. While it is believed that much of the information pertaining to conditions which may affect the cost of the work are shown on the Plans or indicated in the Specifications, neither the Burleigh County Water Resource District nor Houston Engineering, Inc., hereafter called the "Consulting Engineer", warrants the completeness or accuracy of such information. The Contractor shall ascertain the existence of conditions affecting the cost of the work, which would have been disclosed by a reasonable examination of the site.
- F. The Contractor shall give the work the constant attention necessary to facilitate the progress thereof, and shall cooperate with the Consulting Engineer, County Engineer and other Contractors in every way possible to complete the project within the designated time frame and authorized extensions.
- G. The Contractor shall thoroughly examine all project documents as well as any associated or related Burleigh County Water Resource District or manufacturer's documents. Any reliance upon information provided shall be solely at the discretion and risk of the Contractor. Owner makes no guarantee that conditions will not vary from those discovered at the time the investigations were conducted.



H. The Contractor shall consider all federal, state and local laws and regulations that may affect the cost, progress and performance of the work.



III. PROPOSAL

- A. The Bidder hereby certifies that he has personally examined the location and construction details of work outlined on the plans and specifications for the construction of the McDowell Dam Bank Stabilization 2024 Project Bismarck, North Dakota.
- **B.** Further, the bidder certifies that he has read and thoroughly understands the plans and specifications and contract documents governing the work associated with these improvements and the method by which payment will be made for said work.
- C. In submitting this bid, it is understood that the right to reject any and all bids is reserved to the **Owner**, and it is agreed that this bid may not be withdrawn during the period of days provided in the Information to Bidders.
- D. The quantities shown are <u>estimated</u> quantities based on information available at the time of design. It is mutually understood that these quantities may change at the time of construction due to changes or unforeseen conditions which may be encountered during construction. <u>Payment will be made for the final amount of work completed at unit prices specified in the contract.</u> Linear and ton quantities may be rounded to the nearest foot or ton. Those quantities for imported materials measured in CY or TON will be paid based on quantity from load tickets collected from a certified scale and provided to the Engineer, or other accepted basis mutually agreed upon BEFORE the material is delivered to site, unless otherwise agreed to in writing.

V. SPECIAL PROJECT PROVISIONS

SPECIAL PROVISION NO. 1 Consulting Engineer's Status During Construction

The Consulting Engineer will be Owner's representative during the construction period. The duties and responsibilities and the limitations of authority of the Consulting Engineer as Owner's representative during construction are as set forth and will not be changed without written consent of Owner and Consulting Engineer.

Consulting Engineer will make visits to the site at intervals appropriate to the various stages of construction as deemed necessary in order to observe as an experienced and qualified design professional the progress that has been made and the quality of the various aspects of Contractor's executed work. Based on information obtained during such visits and observations, Consulting Engineer, for the benefit of the Owner, will determine, in general, if the work is proceeding in accordance with the Contract Documents. Consulting Engineer will not be required to make exhaustive or continuous inspections on the site to check the quality or quantity of the work. Consulting Engineer's efforts will be directed toward providing for the Owner a greater degree of confidence that the completed work will conform generally to the contract documents. On the basis of such visits and observations, Consulting Engineer will keep the Owner informed of the progress of the work.

Consulting Engineer's visits and observations are subject to all the limitations on Consulting Engineer's authority and responsibility. Particularly, but without limitation, during or as a result of Consulting Engineer's visits or observations of Contractor's work Consulting Engineer will not supervise, direct, control, or have authority over or be responsible for Contractor's means, methods, techniques, sequences, or procedures of construction, or the safety precautions and programs incident thereto, or for any failure of Contractor to comply with Laws and Regulations applicable to the performance of the work.

SPECIAL PROVISION NO. 2 Limitations on Consulting Engineer's Authority

Neither Consulting Engineer's authority or responsibility under this section or under any other provision of the contract documents nor any decision made by Consulting Engineer in good faith either to exercise or not exercise such authority or responsibility or the undertaking, exercise, or performance of any authority or responsibility by Consulting Engineer shall create, impose, or give rise to any duty in contract, tort, or otherwise owed by Consulting Engineer to Contractor, any Subcontractor, any Supplier, any other individual or entity, or to any surety for or employee or agent of any of them.



Consulting Engineer will not be responsible for the acts or omissions of Contractor or of any Subcontractor, any Supplier, or of any other individual or entity performing any of the work. The Consulting Engineer shall have general authority to ensure that all work complies with the plans and specifications and has authority to stop the work when such stoppage may, in his opinion, be necessary to ensure proper execution of the contract and overall project quality. The Consulting Engineer also has the authority to reject all work and materials which do not conform to the plans and specifications and to decide all questions which arise in the execution of the work. The Consulting Engineer shall not be obliged to approve or give opinions as to the construction procedures, methods or means. All such decisions of the Consulting Engineer shall be final.

SPECIAL PROVISION NO. 3 Changes in Work

The Consulting Engineer may authorize minor variations in the work from the requirements of the plans and specifications which do not involve an adjustment in the contract price. Such authorizations should not materially affect the size of the project and shall be compatible with the original design concept. This work may be accomplished by a Field Order and will be binding on the Owner and Contractor. The Contractor shall perform the Field Order work involved promptly.

If the Contractor or Consulting Engineer agree that extra work is necessary that was not contemplated in the plans and that no price has been determined; then, said parties shall endeavor to agree on a price for said work. Assuming an agreeable amount has been determined, the work shall be accomplished by Change Order. Change Orders are subject to approval by the Owner.

If the Contractor contends that additional compensation is due for work or material not covered in the contract, the Contractor shall notify the Consulting Engineer in writing of the intention to file a claim and the basis for additional compensation before beginning or continuing construction of the affected work. If the basis for the claim does not become apparent until after proceeding with the work and it is not feasible to stop the work, the Contractor shall immediately notify the Consulting Engineer the work is continuing and that written notification to file a claim shall be submitted within ten calendar days. The failure to give the required notification or to provide the Consulting Engineer proper assistance in keeping strict account of actual costs will constitute a waiver of the claim. Notification of the claim, and the fact that the Consulting Engineer has kept account of the costs involved, shall not be construed as proving or substantiating the claims validity. The Consulting Engineer will review each claim and within 30 days of the last submittal will recommend either acceptance or denial. Said recommendation will be forwarded to the Owner. The final decision on acceptance of the claim shall rest with the Owner.

The Consulting Engineer may direct work to be done on an hourly basis when the measurement and payment are not practical due to circumstance. Hourly work will be performed according to the Contractor's hourly rates. The Contractor shall submit a



standard rate sheet for manpower and equipment rates prior to beginning Work on the project.

SPECIAL PROVISION NO. 4 Award and Contract Security

The Bidder to whom the award is made will be required to enter into a written contract with the Owner. Simultaneously with the Contractor's delivery of the executed contract, the Contractor shall furnish a performance bond in an amount at least equal to one hundred percent (100%) for the total contract amount as security for the faithful performance of the contract and also a payment bond in an amount not less than one hundred percent (100%) of the total contract amount as security for the payment of all persons performing labor on the project under the contract and furnishing materials in connection with the contract.

Upon award of the Contract, Owner reserves the right to withhold issuance of the Notice to Proceed until the completion of a Jurisdictional Determination and approved Nationwide Permit from the Corps of Engineers. Any delays to the Contractor incurred as a result of waiting for the completion of the permit shall not be the basis for any claim beyond the addition of an equal number of days added to the Substantial Completion and Final Completion dates for the project.

SPECIAL PROVISION NO. 5 Contractor's Insurance

Burleigh County Water Resource District and Houston Engineering, Inc. shall also be listed as additional insureds under all required policies.

SPECIAL PROVISION NO. 6 Utility Note

It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to familiarize themselves with the location of all existing sewer and water mains, forcemains and service lines, gas mains, and service lines, telephone, cable television, power, light, telephone poles, fiber optic and guys, valve boxes, and stop boxes and all utility installations that might be affected in the performance of the work. The Contractor shall notify all utility companies at least 48 hours in advance of any construction affecting said utilities, and the Contractor and the Owner shall work out with said utilities any conflicts or changes. The Contractor shall coordinate with utility companies for any temporary or relocated utilities.

SPECIAL PROVISION NO. 7 Indemnity Agreement

The Owner and the Contractor agree to indemnify from and against all loss or expense, including attorney's fees and costs by reason of liability imposed by law upon the Owner, its elected or appointed officials or employees for damages because of bodily injury



including death at any time resulting therefrom sustained by any person or persons and on account of damage to property including loss of use thereof, arising out of or in consequence of the performance of the work or other requirement hereunder.

SPECIAL PROVISION NO. 8 Removals and Debris Cleanup

Contractor shall remove and dispose of all visible trash and debris, including debris uncovered during the course of the work. The cost for all labor, equipment, materials, transportation and disposal of debris shall be included in the unit price bid for Clearing and Grubbing. Dispose of all material at an approved disposal site, landfill or recycling facility as appropriate.

Extra materials, tools, and temporary structures shall be removed by the Contractor and all dirt, rubbish, and excess material shall be disposed of and the construction area left with a neat appearance. The Contractor shall conduct operations in such manner as to cause minimum inconvenience to adjoining property owners and the public. Any dirt, mud tracking or other debris left on adjacent roadways shall be removed at the end of each work day and all adjacent paved road surfaces shall be cleaned by the use of power broom or other suitable method as approved by the Engineer.

If disturbed by construction activity, adjacent street, access road, trail and parking lot surfacing in both paved and unpaved areas shall be restored to as good as or better than prior to construction by the Contractor. The Contractor will be required to replace paving or gravel surface removed or damaged during the construction work or repair any area disturbed or damaged as a result of Contractor's activity. All costs to repair or replace any surfacing, sidewalk, walking trail or curb and gutter outside of the construction limits which is damaged or removed as a result of construction activity will be at the Contractor's expense.

SPECIAL PROVISION NO. 9 Erosion Control

The Contractor will be the originator and signer of the Stormwater Discharge Permit (SWPPP) and will be responsible for controlling erosion and sediment runoff from the project. During the course of the work, the Contractor shall install, maintain and repair if necessary, in accordance with best management practices and the SWPPP, all erosion and siltation control devices established for this project. The Contractor shall minimize tracking of soil and debris onto adjacent properties, roadways and bodies of water and shall minimize all wind and water erosion. Tracking must be removed by the end of each workday. Contractor shall minimize dust and noise from construction activity and shall observe quiet hours from 9pm to 7am. The costs for all labor, equipment and materials to furnish and install erosion control devices established for this project shall be included in the unit price bid for the associated Work.



SPECIAL PROVISION NO. 10 Landowner Agreements

The CONTRACTOR shall stay within the construction limits as shown on the plan and any temporary construction easements acquired for the project. The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for any damage caused by the Contractor, Subcontractors or Suppliers to property outside the construction limits and shall make satisfactory settlement for such damage directly with the property owner and/or tenants involved. CONTRACTOR shall make separate arrangements with landowners on an individual basis if desiring to go beyond the construction limits. CONTRACTOR shall document each separate agreement with landowners in writing and furnish copies of documentation to the Engineer.

SPECIAL PROVISION NO. 11 Topsoil Stripping

All areas to be excavated, disturbed or receive fill which have existing topsoil shall have the topsoil stripped and stockpiled at an approved location. Topsoil shall be placed back and spread evenly after construction unless otherwise directed by Engineer. All associated costs for stripping, salvaging and restoring topsoil shall be incidental to the cost of the Work.

SPECIAL PROVISION NO. 12 Grading

Contractor shall perform grading and shaping in areas indicated to perform earthwork and shape fill as indicated. All transportation, labor and equipment to perform site grading for shaping shall be incidental to the cost of the Work. This includes final placement, smoothing and shaping of all materials placed. No payment for grading shall be made for Work done beyond the limits or quantity indicated in the plans unless approved in writing or directed by the Engineer.

SPECIAL PROVISION NO. 13 Riprap

Riprap of the size indicated shall be placed as directed and as indicated in the project documents and per City specification 802-2.19. All Riprap shall be placed on type RR Geotextile Fabric. The costs for all labor, equipment, materials, logistics, and other incidental items required to furnish, transport and place the riprap shall be included in the unit price bid for Riprap-Type M. All costs for the labor, equipment, materials, logistics, and other incidental items required to furnish and place Type RR Geotextile fabric under the riprap shall be paid for at the unit price bid for Geotextile Fabric Type RR. Alternate riprap placement areas have been identified. Owner may elect to place geotextile fabric and riprap in these areas at Owner's discretion and as directed by Engineer.



SPECIAL PROVISION NO. 14 Restoration and Seeding

Upon completion, all areas inside the construction limits that are not gravel or paved shall be restored, properly prepared and seeded (unless otherwise noted). All seeding shall be seeded per City of Bismarck Class VI unless otherwise noted. Seed mixture shall consist of the NDDOT Class II Late Season mix from Table 251-01 of the NDDOT Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction (October 2014), or approved comparable seed mixture. All costs for removing ruts and tracking, restoring all disturbed areas as near as practicable to preconstruction conditions and seeding at all sites in the construction limits shall be included in the unit price bid and plan quantity for Seeding Class VI. Any costs for removing ruts and tracking, restoring grass areas, restoring all disturbed areas as near as practicable to preconstruction conditions and seeding beyond the construction limits shall be at the Contractor's expense. Due to steepness and uneven terrain, seeding shall be conducted by means of surface broadcasting and hand raking to incorporate the seed into the soil.

Temporary Maintenance: Repairs shall be made to seeding as necessary before final acceptance as directed by the ENGINEER. All areas that have been properly seeded and accepted by the ENGINEER that have to be reseeded because of wind or water erosion shall be at the OWNER's expense. All areas damaged by traffic or the construction operations shall be repaired at the CONTRACTOR's expense.

SPECIAL PROVISION NO. 15 Fence

Where necessary, existing fences, gates, and other features within the construction limits may be removed and replaced to allow passage and conduct the Work as required. All fences, gates and other features which are removed shall be restored to original or better condition. If materials are damaged or cannot be placed back in original or better condition, they shall be replaced with new materials, or other remedy as acceptable to the property owner shall be provided. All costs to remove and reset existing fence, gates and associated features will not be paid for separately and shall be included in the unit price bid for the associated Work.

SPECIAL PROVISION NO. 16 Trail Restoration

Existing trails that are damaged by haul truck traffic will be repaired after the bank stabilization work is completed. After all hauling and traffic on the trail is completed, the trail shall be restored. All costs for labor, materials and equipment to restore the trail shall be incidental to the cost of the Work.



SPECIAL PROVISION NO. 17 Walking Path/Trail Closure

The Work will be conducted in a public area frequented by pedestrian and recreational traffic and the Contractor shall be alert for pedestrians in the work zone. Before Work commences, Contractor shall erect Trail Closure Barricades and orange Safety Fence at the locations indicated and as directed if additional barricades or fence are needed. Barricades and Safety Fence shall be maintained throughout the duration of the project to separate the general public from the construction area and deter entrance by pedestrians. Contractor shall furnish and install signage as appropriate to inform the general public of the active work zone and that the area is closed to pedestrian traffic. Signage shall be included with the Trail Closure Barricades and Safety Fence. Contractor shall coordinate with the Park District for the trail closure and placement of the barricades and to give notice to the general public of the closure. All costs to furnish, install, maintain and to remove upon completion shall be included in the unit price bid for Trail Closure Barricades and Safety Fence.

SPECIAL PROVISION NO. 18 Construction Access and Material Staging

The Contractor shall not deviate from approved haul routes shown in the contract documents without written permission from the Owner or the Engineer. Damages caused by the Contractor's equipment deviating from approved haul routes shall be repaired at the Contractor's sole expense.

Construction materials shall be staged in approved areas designated in the contract documents. The Contractor shall not stage equipment or construction materials outside of the designated staging area without written permission from the Owner or the Engineer. The Contractor shall review the site and determine what considerations, if any, are needed to accommodate the trucks and equipment being used.

All costs for all labor, equipment, materials, and incidentals to access the site and to perform all ground restoration as necessary, to include removing ruts and loosening soil on cultivated land, for all areas where access was made to as near as practicable to original conditions shall be incidental to the cost of the Work.







Loren,

I am familiar with this location, and I do remember flooding in the past. One of our operators and I went out and raised 2 of the manhole lids, and sealed them up the best we could. If this area continues to be inundated with water, the sealed manholes will eventually fail again. It would be better for everyone if the drainage through here was addressed.

If the temporary fix we completed begins to fail, the lift station along hole #1 may not be able to keep up with the inflow, and will overflow, as it has in the past. Additionally, when the lift station is running 24 hours a day to keep up, the treatment plant then becomes overwhelmed, and may overflow.

As I stated above, the best fix would be to address the drainage through this area. If some fill is required around the existing manholes, we could install adjustment rings to raise the cover to, or above, the new groundline.

If you have any additional questions, or would like to discuss further, please let me know.

Attached find photos from the area up at Haw tree along Clubhouse drive where we always have a drainage issue during the spring thaw, & during major rain events. This issue has been going on for years and the HOA has concerns regarding water getting into the septic system and causing damage.

I spoke to you in August of 2024 when we had the major rain event and at that time you stated that SCW had raised the man hole cover and sealed it. We have a couple of questions?

- 1. Is raising & sealing this a long term solution or would it be worth it for us to explore the costs to redo the drainage?
- 2. If the current remedy fails what effects could this potentially have on our system
- 3. What would SCW recommend for us to address this issue permanently?

The following are the summary of some options that could be considered for Lot 1, Block1 (7911 Club House Drive) by Clubhouse Drive:

- The driveways and culverts at 8001 Clubhouse Drive and 8009 Clubhouse Drive could be removed and the culverts reset to facilitate drainage to the intersection of Clubhouse Drive and Link Drive in accordance with the Stormwater Management Plan (SWMP).
- 2. A culvert could be installed under Clubhouse Drive to drain northwest, but it could not drain through the driving range of the golf course. There are 2 options that could meet this:
 - a. The culvert is installed and then a berm is placed in the Right-of-Way that is parallel to Clubhouse Drive. This berm would contain the flow of water in the ditch within the Right-of-Way and allow the stormwater to drain northeast to Link Drive. This stormwater would then drain along Link Drive in accordance with the approved SWMP. The modifying of the culvert under the road and the berm would require an amendment to the approved SWMP.
 - b. The culvert is installed and then an underground storm sewer is placed in the Right-of-Way that is parallel to Clubhouse Drive and potentially Link Drive depending on elevations. This culvert would be sized to slowly release the flow of water while allowing the stormwater to drain northeast to Link Drive. This stormwater would then drain along Link Drive in accordance with the approved SWMP. The modifying of the culvert under the road and storm sewer would require an amendment to the approved SWMP.
- 3. A temporary pump could be purchased and operated by the HOA to drain stormwater out on an as needed basis. The pump would need to direct the stormwater to Link Drive to stay in accordance with the SWMP. If it is pumped into the driving range, that would be a negative impact to the downstream landowner and would not be in accordance with the SWMP for the identified drainage path.

There are pros/cons and costs to each option. The County is willing to work towards a solution, but we are not authorized to contribute any money. The County's position would be that the approved SWMP needs to be met and it is the landowners responsibility to be in accordance with the SWMP. Please let me know of any questions or comments.





The Burleigh County Water Resource District (District) is seeking cost share for the *Apple Creek Slope Stability Evaluation* associated with a significant land slide site located to the west of the University of Mary, south of Bismarck and associated flood risks. While the District has submitted a Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) grant application, see submittal included in this request. There are several purposes for this application. First, is this request to have the NDDWR evaluate project eligibility under the rural flood control policy. This project is unique in its nature as to flood protection measures and may not fit within the standard cost share policy. However, the impacts from a slope failure are significant as is relates to flood risk and damage. Second, the Emergency Action Plan that is part of the SA#30 Scope of Services is ineligible under the HMGP program but may be eligible for state cost share.

This letter serves as the Burleigh County Water Resource District's (District) commitment to meet the local matching fund requirements for the *Apple Creek Slope Stability Evaluation*. Based on full eligibility the total cost is \$307,546, which at 45% our request is \$138,396. If only the Emergency Action Plan is eligible the cost for that is \$10,000, which at 45% is \$4,500

We anticipate a decision on the HMGP application sometime in June, though no specific date has been provided by NDDES. Please advise if additional information is desired or if a meeting to discuss the application would be appropriate. Your assistance is greatly appreciated.

This site is at risk for a significant landslide and is located to the west of a previous BRIC grant project to stabilize the slope downhill from buildings and facilities located on the University of Mary Campus (Bismarck, ND). While completing its construction there was movement in the lower slope along Apple Creek that created a significant obstruction to the stream flows and extensive bank erosion threatening the loss of Sibley Drive. The influence of the movement that occurred in the upper slope and the impacts on the lower slope remain undetermined. The following is a summary of the parcels identified as being impacted by a potential slope failure and resulting backwaters during the selected Apple Creek flow. 174 parcels W/Structures (Direct Impact) are in the impact area upstream of landslide. 84 parcels with no structures are at risk upstream, 147 parcels downstream could lose access if Sibley Drive is restricted.

See the three attached "After Action Reports" in the HMGP Grant Application and photos for information on actions taken by the Burleigh County Highway Department, Emergency Management and the Burleigh County Water Resource District. The landslide slope failure has the potential to cut off stream flows on Apple Creek as well as block access to Sibly Drive and residential streets to the south. Projected backwaters from a 10-yr stream flow during a slope failure has the ability to create backwater flooding equal to or greater than the mapped DFIRM Base Flood Elevation (BFE) or 100-year flood event. 

After visiting with DE\$ regarding this application they provide the following comments:

- 1. The Emergency Action Plan funds \$10,000 are not eligible for the grant.
 - a. These can remain in the scope of work and SA#30.
- 2. Given the increased cost DES noted to us that there would be a \$275,000 cap to the grant
 - There is the potential opportunity for additional funding, should other projects not fully utilize their moneys
 - b. Though at this time this would be the cap with the fund distribution as noted below
- 3. DES will submit the application to FEMA after the Board concurs with the budget figures now updated.
- 4. The Application has the potential to be funded in May or June
- 5. After the application is submitted DES concurs with the non-earthwork elements beginning prior to grant approval
 - a. This allows Braun and BGC to being reviewing the existing U-Mary Data to expedite review.

Pursuant to **Exhibit A** of the Agreement for Engineering Services, dated May 14, 2013, by and between the Burleigh County Water Resource District (BCWRD) and Houston Engineering, Inc. (ENGINEER), *Specific Authorization No. 30* is hereby provided to the ENGINEER.

OBJECTIVE

The objective of this Scope of Services is to assist the Burleigh County Water Resource District in completing an evaluation of the slope stability risks along Apple Creek to the west of the University of Mary campus and east of Sibley Drive. The location of this site is illustrated on *Appendix A*, which includes the vicinity map and preliminary impact area. The upper slope was being stabilized via a project implementation to alleviate upper slope failure risks. However, prior to project completion the site experienced slumping, which the owner is looking to evaluate and complete their mitigation project. It is not definitively known if this slumping resulted in the adverse impacts to the Apple Creek channel and Sibley Drive. This scope will review the upper slope remediation measures to determine if there is a need for additional remediation measures to protect the lower slope along Apple Creek, that will not result undesired risks to the upstream project, as well as mitigate potential adverse impacts and damages to public infrastructure and private properties.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The Scope of Services is divided into four (4) phases which identify the significant elements of the proposed services, as follows:

Phase 001 – Engineering Services Agreement (ESA) No Charge - \$0.00

Phase 001 includes preparing this scope of services (*Specific Authorization #30*) for acceptance by Burleigh County Water Resource District (Client).

Phase 001 deliverable is the completed and signed Specific Authorization #30.

Phase 002 – Geotechnical Evaluation and Coordination \$ 277,547

Phase 002 includes a \$5,000 budget to coordinate and oversight a geotechnical evaluation to be completed by Braun Intertec, and their subconsultant BGC. Their fees totaling \$272,547 (\$60,686 and \$211,861 respectively) and a summary of services are described in separate proposal documents in *Appendix B*.

Phase 002 deliverable is the completed geotechnical evaluation, findings, report and recommendations.

Phase 003 - Emergency Action Plan

Phase 003 includes preparing an Emergency Action Plan to address the notification, communication and response protocol should a significant slope failure occur. This will be completed prior to the final study report to address existing risks before future mitigation measures are implemented.

Phase 004 – Impact Evaluation and Economic Analysis

Phase 004 involves evaluating and documenting the risks, location and type of impacts or potential impacts associated with a slope failure. This information will be utilized to determine the benefit cost analysis associated with any future project or risk mitigation activity for a preferred alternative.

Phase 004 deliverable is a table outlining the potential impacts and damage estimates associated with a slope failure, an economic analysis of those impacts to be used for a projected benefit cost analysis.

The project schedule is subject to securing grant funding approval, completion of the subconsultant geotechnical evaluation services, additional site exploration and final report. The emergency action plan, impact evaluation and economic analysis will be completed concurrently with the geotechnical evaluation. The Project Executive Summary will be completed after the final geotechnical evaluation and is anticipated on or before August 2025.

COMPENSATION

The total budget for the evaluation and related activities is \$307,547 and is not to be exceeded without prior written approval. Compensation will be invoiced on an hourly time and materials based on the total budget and not on individual phase budgets. The rate schedule for HEI will be that authorized by the Board in January 2025. Invoices from HEI be sent to the Burleigh County Water Resource District for payment. Invoices from Braun Intertec will also be sent to the BCWRD, with a copy to HEI for review and recommendation for approval prior to payment.












Potential High Risk Flooding Area











Potential High Risk Flooding Area



Braun Intertec Corporation respectfully submits this proposal to complete a geotechnical evaluation for the landslide on Apple Creek. For this project, we are working with BGC Engineering, who will be performing the slope stability evaluations of this site. Their proposal is attached. Please note that our proposals have been revised from our October 29, 2024 based on a revised scope of work that includes instrument telemetry, additional change detection evaluations, and updated rates for 2025.

Project Information

Please see the attached proposal from BGC Engineering for a summary and description of the scope of work that will be performed to evaluate the cause and potential mitigation methods for the Apple Creek Landslide. They will work as our subconsultant for this project. We will pass their cost through without markup.

We understand that Burleigh County may apply for a grant through several agencies to assist with funding the design and construction of this project. We anticipate that portions of our work may be authorized to begin monitoring as soon as practical, but that the complete geotechnical evaluation may not be authorized until the spring of 2025.

Purpose

The purpose of our geotechnical evaluation will be to support BGC during their reconnaissance and evaluations, characterize subsurface geologic conditions at selected exploration locations, and monitor the instrumentation installed.

Scope of Services

We propose the following tasks to help achieve the stated purpose. If we encounter unfavorable or unforeseen conditions during the completion of our tasks that lead us to recommend an expanded scope of services, we will contact you to discuss the conditions before resuming our services. Our work will correspond to supporting the 4 principal tasks described in BGC's proposal.

Task 1 – Site Reconnaissance and Monitoring

During BGC's site visit, we will provide a staff engineer with a Trimble Catalyst GPS receiver configured to record horizontal and vertical positions of features to centimeter accuracy. We will also use our Unmanned Aerial Vehicle to obtain an orthophoto image of the site and a 3D model for subsequent slope stability evaluations. We will provide our observations in a CAD file for use in BGC's plan and analysis.

We will stake prospective subsurface exploration locations, as selected by BGC, by taking the aerial imagery or site plan provided and overlaying it into our GIS. We will extract the latitude and longitude of boring locations from the program and enter them into our Trimble Catalyst GPS receiver.

We will obtain surface elevations at the boring locations using our Trimble Catalyst GPS receiver and report elevations relative to the WGS 84 datum.

Task 2 - Investigation

Braun Intertec will drill two borings, install instrumentation, perform laboratory tests, and monitor the equipment as follows:

Site Access

Based on a site visit, the site will require an all-terrain vehicle (ATV) drill rig. We assume there will be no cause for delays in accessing the exploration locations. We are not including tree clearing, debris or obstruction removal, grading of navigable paths, or snow plowing.

Depending on access requirements, ground conditions or potential utility conflicts, our field crew may alter the exploration locations from those proposed to facilitate accessibility.

Our drilling activities may also impact the vegetation and may rut the surface to access boring locations. Restoration of vegetation and turf is not part of our scope of services.

Utility Clearance

Prior to drilling or excavating, we will contact North Dakota One Call and arrange for notification of the appropriate utility vendors to mark and clear the exploration locations of public underground utilities. You, or your authorized representative, are responsible to notify us before we begin our work of the presence and location of any underground objects or private utilities that are not the responsibility of public agencies.

If you, or your authorized representative, cannot locate underground objects or private utilities that are suspected or known to exist, we can retain a private locate company for an additional fee. Fees charged will include 1.15x the subcontractor fee and additional time from our staff to coordinate the work on site. If performed, the property owner must also be available to assist the private locate company in determining the presence of any underground objects or the location of utilities. We will not be liable for any damages resulting from unidentified or misidentified underground objects or utilities. Further, we reserve the right to stop work if underground objects or utilities are suspected or known to exist, but locations cannot be accurately determined.

Permits

Prior to commencing with field work, we assume others will obtain permits or written permission from property owners for proposed explorations located outside of the public right-of-way.

Penetration Test Borings

We propose to drill two standard penetration test (SPT) borings for the project. We will perform standard penetration tests at 2 1/2-foot vertical intervals to a depth of about 20 feet, and at 5-foot intervals to a depth of 100 feet. We anticipate the borings will be on the eastern side of Apple Creek in the hummocky area.

We have also made provisions to obtain 6 thin-walled tube samples of the soils encountered for laboratory testing.

If the intended boring depths do not extend through unsuitable material, we will extend the borings at least 5 feet into suitable material at greater depths. The additional information will help evaluate such issues as excavation depth, consolidation settlement, and foundation alternatives, among others. If we identify a need for deeper (or additional) borings, we will contact you prior to increasing our total estimated drilled footage and submit a Change Order summarizing the anticipated additional effort and the associated cost, for your review and authorization.

Groundwater Measurements

If the borings encounter groundwater during or immediately after drilling of each boring, we will record the observed depth on the boring logs. We anticipate drilling with mud rotary techniques, so subsequent groundwater measurements may not be possible.

Instrumentation

We will install 3.34-inch-diameter (largest available) slope inclinometer casing into each boring at completion. We will attach 2 vibrating wire piezometers at depths to be determined that will be provided by BGC. The casing and vibrating wires will be grouted in place.

Sample Review and Laboratory Testing

We will return recovered samples to our laboratory, where a geotechnical engineer will visually classify and log them. To help classify the materials encountered and estimate the engineering properties necessary to our analyses, we have budgeted to perform the following laboratory tests.

We will determine the actual laboratory testing for the project depending on the encountered subsurface conditions. If we identify a laboratory testing program that exceeds the budget included in this proposal but provides additional value to the project, we will request authorization for the additional fees through a Change Order.

Monitoring

BGC will install Shape Array inclinometers and a telemetry system to monitor the slope movement and groundwater levels on a continual basis.

Task 3. Collaboration

Our principal engineers will work closely with BGC to support them during their geotechnical analyses, and will assist in the preparation of a final report with our boring logs, aerial images, laboratory test results, monitoring results and participate in up to two team meetings.

Task 4. Photogrammetry Change Detection Support

We have obtained periodic aerial images of the site since May 2025 that may be used by BGC Engineering. We intend to work with BGC to provide the information in a format that they can use.

Schedule

We anticipate performing our work according to BGC's schedule.

Fees

We will furnish the services described in this proposal for an estimated fee of \$60,686. This is in addition to BGC's estimated fee for a total estimated cost of \$211,861, for a total estimated cost of \$272,547.

Our work may extend over several invoicing periods. As such, we will submit partial progress invoices for work we perform during each invoicing period.

Additional Services

Our fees do not include potential costs due to the need for snow plowing, towing, stand-by time, or work that is not included in the above Scope of Services. We will charge costs for snow plowing or towing (if necessary) at a rate of 1.15 times the actual cost. For stand-by time (defined as time spent by our field crew due to circumstances that are beyond the control of our field crew or its equipment, or beyond the scope of services indicated above), we will charge a rate of \$479 per hour.



1.0 INTRODUCTION

BGC Engineering USA Inc. (BGC) is pleased to provide Braun Intertec Corporation with the following proposal for investigation planning, monitoring support, analysis, and mitigation conceptual design for the Apple Creek landslide located below the University of Mary, in Burleigh County, North Dakota. This proposal presents the proposed scope of work, methodology, key personnel, project team, schedule, and cost estimate for the project.

This work will be performed per the terms of BGC's Professional Service Agreement with Braun Intertec Corporation (Braun Intertec) having an effective date of June 01, 2024, attached in Appendix A.

2.0 BGC ENGINEERING

BGC Engineering is an international consulting firm that provides professional services in applied earth science. Founded in 1990, we provide professional services to address a broad spectrum of complex engineering and geoscience challenges. BGC delivers a full range of earth science consulting services including site investigations, design, permitting support, construction supervision and independent third-party reviews.

3.0 BACKGROUND AND PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

BGC's understanding of the project background is based on

- Discussions during a meeting held on August 22, 2024, between BGC, the University of Mary, and Braun Intertec,
- A meeting held on October 17, 2024, with Burleigh County Emergency Management officials and Braun Intertec,
- Documents provided to BGC by the University of Mary,
- An email from Justin Messner, Disaster Recovery Chief, North Dakota Department of Emergency Services (NDDES), on January 27, 2025 summarizing the path forward for the University of Mary slope stabilization project, and
- Discussions with Wes Dickhut of Braun Intertec and Michael Gunsch of Houston Engineering.

The University of Mary sits on a bluff overlooking the Missouri River valley about 5 miles south of Bismarck, North Dakota. At this location, Apple Creek runs along the toe of the bluff along the eastern edge of the Missouri River valley. Sibley Drive, owned and maintained by Burleigh County, is located adjacent to Apple Creek on the side opposite of the University of Mary bluff. Landsliding has been observed on the slopes below the University of Mary campus for several decades, in addition to other slopes along the bluffs beyond the campus.

The University of Mary previously obtained a FEMA Grant to investigate, analyze, design and construct slope stabilization for an active landslide below the cemetery and other university infrastructure. Wenck Associates, Inc. (Wenck) completed a slope stability hazard investigation in 2015 and provided the Slope Stability Hazard Investigation: Final Report, dated November 9, 2016. This report identified the north end of the bluff adjacent to the North Campus Residence Hall (North Dormitory) and the south end of the bluff near the cemetery (and below Boniface West Hall) as having the greatest potential for damage with continued bluff movement. The report includes stabilization options, recommended mitigation, and cost estimates for these two areas. Mitigation construction for the northern landslide area below the North Campus Residence Hall was completed in 2020.

In 2022, the University of Mary contracted Barr Engineering Co. (Barr) to further investigate subsurface conditions and design mitigation for the southern landslide below Boniface West Hall and the cemetery. The project was referred to as Phase II Slope Stabilization in the project plans prepared by Barr, dated September 30, 2022. The Phase II Slope Stabilization project was constructed in 2023.

The University of Mary noted that landslide movement was observed throughout the mitigation construction, and they have observed movement post-construction that appeared to be at a faster rate than prior to the start of construction. BGC's understanding is that all previously installed slope inclinometer casing has sheared and no longer readable with a slope inclinometer probe.

During the summer and fall of 2024, Burleigh County personnel observed erosion along the banks of Apple Creek below the landslide and adjacent to Sibley Drive resulting in loss of embankment material supporting the roadway and trees falling into the creek. As an emergency response fallen trees were removed from the creek and approximately 350 lineal feet of riprap was placed along the banks of Apple Creek below Sibley Drive. Houston Engineering completed a flood impact mapping analysis for a slope failure and a 10-year Apple Creek event and found that the flooding would impact a large area of private property and infrastructure. The Burleigh County Water Resources Department/Houston Engineering in collaboration with the Burleigh County Highway Department, Burleigh County Emergency Manager, and North Dakota Department of Emergency Services began evaluating grant funding options for evaluation of the failure and associated risks.

Justin Messner indicated in an email on January 27, 2025 that following two meetings between NDDES and the University of Mary that Barr will submit a proposal for additional geotechnical investigation and instrumentation to analyze the fill material used in the slope regrading and to identify any slope movement. Justin indicated that investigation and instrumentation information collected by Barr will be provided to Houston Engineering and Braun/BGC.

4.0 SCOPE OF WORK AND METHODOLOGY

Based on discussions with Wes Dickhut and Micheal Gunsch and BGC's understanding of the project, BGC proposes the following Tasks. BGC understands that the priority for this project is stabilization of the ongoing landsliding adjacent to Apple Creek to protect private property and infrastructure during Apple Creek flood events. This scope of work is specific to the site located along Apple Creek between Sibley Drive and the University of Mary Phase II Slope Stabilization project (Schematic 1). Other landslides are observed along Apple Creek in the vicinity of this project; however, they may not pose the same risk to public infrastructure and are not part of this project scope.

4.1 Task 1 – Site Visit and Reconnaissance Mapping

A Principal level geotechnical engineer and an intermediate level engineering geologist will visit the site to perform a reconnaissance of the landslide. This will include mapping landslide features such as scarps, tension cracks, seeps, springs, ground movement into Apple Creek, and nearby infrastructure. This information will be used to develop a surficial geologic map and general understanding of the landslide and site conditions at the time of observation. The results of the reconnaissance will support other tasks, including subsurface investigation planning and building a geologic model of the site. This work will be completed when the site is mostly snow free.

4.2 Task 2 – Investigation Plan

BGC will complete a review of existing subsurface information collected at the site (boreholes, slope inclinometer data, piezometer data, subsurface profiles) and publicly available data (geologic maps, lidar mapping, etc.). BGC will review existing subsurface information and the results of the geotechnical reconnaissance and make recommendations for additional subsurface investigation and instrumentation, as needed to support analysis and mitigation design.

The scope of the investigation plan will depend on the results of the geotechnical data review and site reconnaissance. For the cost estimating purposes we have assumed that the investigation plan will include two boreholes to a depth of 100 feet. Each borehole will have slope inclinometer casing and shape accel arrays installed to a depth of 100 feet and two vibrating wire piezometers grouted into the borehole. BGC will provide an investigation plan memorandum that will provide investigation locations, methods, equipment, and access routes, as needed to support any environmental permits. BGC assumes any environmental and/or access permits required for the drilling will be obtained by Braun Intertec or others.

BGC assumes the geotechnical investigation will be conducted by Braun Intertec, including drilling, borehole logging, and procurement and installation of slope inclinometer casing.

4.3 Task 3 – Site Investigation Instrumentation Installation

Instrumentation installed in the boreholes will include a 100-foot long shape accel arrays (SAA) and two vibrating wire piezometers (VWP) in each of the two boreholes. SAAs will be installed inside slope inclinometer casing installed by Braun Intertec. BGC will provide VWPs to Braun Intertec to install with the slope inclinometer casing. An automated data acquisition system (ADAS) will be installed, and telemetry will provide near-real time monitoring of landslide movement. The data will be presented in a GIS-based website along with other remote sensing data (e.g., publicly available lidar).

BGC will procure, setup and install the SAAs and VWPs and ADAS system, including materials, programming, and cellular communication costs. BGC will send two field staff to the site near the completion of drilling to complete the instrumentation installation.

The instrumentation data will be delivered through a web-based, geo-spatial digital data management platform (Cambio Earth) that can be accessed by those approved for access by Burleigh County. This proposal includes full access to Cambio Earth Systems for 1 year.

4.4 Task 4 – Landslide Analysis and Conceptual Designs

BGC assumes the investigation and a minimum of two months of monitoring data will be collected prior to completing this task so that the newly collected data can be used to inform the design. BGC will utilize new and previously collected subsurface data from boring logs, slope inclinometers, piezometers, published geologic maps and site reconnaissance geologic mapping to develop a surface geologic map and 2D subsurface geologic model through the landslide. BGC will use the subsurface model to develop slope stability models through critical sections of the landslide.

BGC will perform 2D limit equilibrium slope stability analyses to evaluate the current conditions and develop conceptual design concepts that meet the objectives of Burleigh County. BGC will provide a minimum of two conceptual mitigation options, as feasible based on the site conditions and Burleigh County objectives. More options or criteria for a trigger response action plan (TARP) will be provided if feasible based on the analysis. A TARP is management tool that can guide interim actions in situations where slide movement is threatening county objectives

before full mitigation can be realized. The design will be carried to a conceptual level that will be adequate to develop rough order of magnitude construction quantities and cost estimates. BGC will develop conceptual details for each option to support quantity take offs and cost estimates. BGC will provide a memorandum summarizing the analysis and conceptual design and include ROM quantities and costs.

This scope does not include development of construction drawings. A proposal and cost estimates for additional design work can be provided once a construction option is selected.

4.5 Task 5 – Photogrammetry Change Detection

University of Mary personnel collected 4 sets of aerial photogrammetry between May 14, 2024, and October 12, 2024. These data are useful for understanding the landslide movement during the summer and fall of 2024, during a period when all other slope monitoring instrumentation at the site was no longer functional. In addition, we anticipate that additional photogrammetry surveys will be collected during execution of this project. BGC is including budget to complete up to seven instances of change analysis on these data sets to determine relative movement compared to the first data set. BGC will only be able to perform the change analysis if the data is of suitable quality. If the change analysis cannot be performed due to data quality, no fees will be charged for the services.

The change analysis data will be also be delivered through Cambio Earth through the internet. This proposal includes full access to Cambio Earth for 1 year. In addition to LCD results being delivered in Cambio Earth, the results can also be provided as geo-tiff files if requested, which can be loaded into a GIS system. The use of Cambio Earth offers users the opportunity to examine the data without relying on others to produce figures. Since the instrumentation will be installed with telemetry, Cambio Earth can be used to review instrumentation data in near-real time.

5.0 KEY PERSONNEL

The project team will involve BGC personnel from the Golden, Colorado, office and will include the following Key Personnel. Additional expertise and input may be provided by BGC personnel as needed. BGC also reserves the right to adjust the project team as required.

Brian Collins, Technical Lead, Project Manager

Brian has over 25 years' experience in infrastructure design with expertise in landslide, debris flow, and erosion emergency response acquired through project experience. Brian strength is providing risk-based practical solutions to complex geotechnical problems. Brian's career includes design experience as an owner, a contractor, and as a consultant, including 10 years with the FHWA Western Federal Lands Highway Division, where he was also the Federal Lands Geotechnical Discipline Champion. Brian initiated and managed several research projects and developed and delivered training, presentations, and multiple professional publications on the

deep patch landslide mitigation technology. Brian recently presented a case history of a horizontal drain landslide mitigation project constructed 7 years ago at the Deep Foundation Institute's 2024 Slope Support and Stabilization conference.

Mark Vessely, Technical Collaborator and Reviewer

Mark Vessely is geotechnical engineer who serves government and private infrastructure owners managing risk from geologic hazards across the western US and Canada. Mark has 30 years of experience across project types ranging from landslide investigation and risk mitigation, signature bridges and highway corridor improvements, and asset management. His current client work includes design for corridor rehabilitation and bridge projects in Yellowstone National Park and implementation of geohazard risk mitigation and retaining wall asset management for Colorado and Montana Departments of Transportation. Mark has led studies directed at the current state of practice for geotechnical instrumentation and monitoring of unstable slopes and probabilistic frameworks for assessing how changing climate conditions influence risk to infrastructure from geohazards.

Scott Anderson, Corporate Oversight

Scott is a Principal Geotechnical Engineer with geotechnical design and construction experience in the transportation, water resources, mining, and pipeline industries. His 40 years of experience include earthwork, retaining structure and foundation design and construction, and ground modification techniques. He is experienced with remote sensing, geophysical and drilling site characterization, and the determination of soil and rock properties and design parameters. He has provided forensic services, oversight and review of design and construction, as well as contributed to research and deployment of training and new technology in areas such as site characterization and slope and foundation design. 7.0 COST ESTIMATE

Table 1 (appended) presents an approximate distribution of the budget and BGC's hourly rates for the tasks outlined in this proposal. The total cost for this scope of work is estimated to be **\$211,861** USD. The estimate uses BGC 2025 rates.

Every effort will be made to stay within this budget both on a task-by-task and overall project basis. The budget will not be exceeded without prior written approval from Braun Intertec. This cost is based on the estimated hours required to complete the work and is not a lump sum. Any hours above or below the estimate will be added or subtracted at the rates provided. The cost estimate shown in Table 1 is valid until April 1, 2025. Subcontractor fees and disbursements for instrumentation materials will be marked up by 10%. Travel costs will be charged at cost (no mark up). Billing will be monthly, usually on the tenth day of the month following the period in which the costs were incurred.

This work will be performed per the terms of BGC's Professional Service Agreement with Braun Intertec Corporation (Braun Intertec) having an effective date of June 01, 2024, attached in Appendix A. BGC Standard Rates for 2025 are attached as Appendix B.

8.0 ASSUMPTIONS AND ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS

The following assumptions and considerations were used to develop this proposal.

- This scope of work does not include performing subsurface investigations, logging boreholes, or laboratory testing. BGC assumes these tasks will be performed by Braun Intertec.
- Several areas of active landsliding have previously been identified in the bluffs below the University of Mary campus. BGC's scope of work is limited to the southern area of

landsliding below the University of Mary cemetery and Boniface West Hall extending downslope towards Apple Creek and Sibley Drive (Schematic 1).

BGC will utilize available topographic data in limit equilibrium slope stability modeling.

APPENDIX A PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

This PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT, effective June 01, 2024, is entered into by and between:

Braun Intertec Corporation ("Consultant"), a Minnesota corporation, whose address is:

AND:

BGC Engineering USA Inc. ("BGC"), a Delaware corporation, whose address is:

600 12th Street, Suite 300 Golden, CO 80401 USA

RECITALS

- Consultant desires BGC to provide Consultant certain Services, and BGC desires to provide Consultant those Services
- B. The Parties entered into this Agreement to establish the terms and conditions that govern all Services BGC provides Consultant.

NOW THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the Parties agree as follows:

DEFINITIONS

When capitalized and used in this Agreement, the following terms have the following meanings:

- "Affiliate" means, with respect to a Party, any entity that is a direct or indirect parent or subsidiary of such Party, or that directly or indirectly: (i) owns or controls such Party, (ii) is owned or controlled by such Party, or (iii) is under common ownership or control with such Party. In this definition, "control" means the power to direct the management or policies of an entity, whether through the ownership of voting securities, by contract, or otherwise.
- "Agreement" means this Professional Services Agreement and any other documents attached hereto or incorporated herein.
- "BGC" has the meaning specified in the preamble of this Agreement.
- "BGC Group" means BGC, BGC's Affiliates, BGC's subcontractors, BGC's sub-consultants, and each of the foregoing Persons' respective Personnel.

"Claim" means any claim, action, demand, proceeding, lawsuit, or cause of action.

"Consultant" has the meaning specified in the preamble of this Agreement.

"Confidential Information" means any non-public information pertaining to a Party's business, operations, Intellectual Property, billing rates, customers, or other affairs. "Confidential Information" includes any information a Party discloses on an expressly confidential basis. The following are not Confidential Information:

- a. information in the public domain (unless due to a breach of this Agreement's confidentiality requirements by a Party, its Affiliate, or their respective Personnel);
- information that was in the Receiving Party's possession without any obligation of confidentiality,
 prior to receipt thereof from the Disclosing Party;
- information received on a non-confidential basis from a Third Party entitled to disclose it on a nonconfidential basis; or
- d. information a Party can prove it independently developed.

"Deliverables" means any reports, drawings, graphic representations, specifications, or other documents which BGC prepares and delivers to Consultant as part of the Services.

"Disclosing Party" means a Party that discloses Confidential Information to the other Party or to such other Party's Personnel.

"Environment" means all parts of the Earth, including: (a) all layers of Earth's atmosphere, land, and water; and (b) all personal property and improvements to real property within, upon, under, or over any part of the Earth.

"Environmental Pollution" means any contamination of the Environment by pollution, hazardous materials, contaminants, or other toxic or harmful substances.

"Force Majeure" means an event or circumstance (other than lack of finances) beyond a Party's reasonable control, which halts or materially hinders the Party's operations or performance. Examples of Force Majeure events include strikes, riots, floods, fires, earthquakes, natural disasters, severe weather, epidemics, pandemics, acts of God or a public enemy, war (whether or not declared), cyberattacks, acts of terrorism, unavailability of transportation or materials, or an act or order of a court or governmental authority affecting performance.

"Intellectual Property" means intellectual property or industrial property of any kind, including ideas, inventions, devices, products, machines, methods, techniques, processes, computer programs, algorithms, code, software, databases, and trade secrets.

"IP Rights" means any registered or unregistered rights anywhere in the world granted, applied for, or otherwise now or hereafter in existence under or related to any patent, copyright, trademark, service mark, industrial design registration, trade secret law, database protection law, or other means for protecting Intellectual Property.

- "Loss" means any loss (including property loss or damage), liability, injury, damage, damages award, arbitration award, judgment, penalty, fine, cost, or expense (including legal fees). For greater certainty, "Losses" also means any one or more of the foregoing forms of Loss.
- "Notes" means any calculations, boring logs, field notes, field data, estimates, numerical models, documents, or rough drafts of Deliverables, which in either case BGC elects to not provide Consultant.
- "Party" means either BGC or Consultant, as applicable. "Parties" means both BGC and Consultant.
- "Person" means any individual, firm, corporation, limited liability company, partnership, trust, joint venture, government entity, or other entity, as the context requires.
- "Personnel" means current, former, and future directors, officers, employees, agents, and representatives.
- "Pre-Existing Site Conditions" means the condition of all structures (including buildings, tailings storage facilities, dams, berms, slopes, containment dykes, impoundments, and earthworks) and Environment on the Project site before BGC provided Services.
- "Project" means the project for which BGC provides Services. BGC may provide Services for multiple different Projects under this Agreement.
- "Receiving Party" means a Party that receives Confidential Information from the other Party or such other Party's Personnel.
- "Scope of Services Document" means the document(s) summarizing the scope of Services BGC agrees to provide Consultant.
- "Services" means any services or work BGC provides Consultant under this Agreement. When applicable, "Services" also includes the provision of goods or materials by BGC to Consultant.
- "Third Party" means any Person other than Consultant, an Affiliate of Consultant, or a BGC Group member.
- "Unknown Conditions" means subsurface conditions or other concealed physical conditions that are unknown to BGC, including conditions which differ from either: (a) those described to BGC by Consultant or Consultant's Personnel; or (b) those identified in graphic representations, reports, or other documents provided to BGC by Consultant or Consultant's Personnel.
- Other terms are defined throughout this Agreement by enclosing the defined term in parentheses and quotation marks after a definition of the term, as follows: ("Defined Term").

1 THE SERVICES

- 1.1 The Scope of Services Document is attached hereto as Exhibit A, and is incorporated herein by reference.
- 1.2 The Parties must agree in writing on the scope of any additional Services BGC provides Consultant. Any such written confirmation of additional Services shall form part of the Scope of Services Document.
- 1.3 Time is of importance, and BGC will perform the Services as expeditiously as is consistent with the professional care, skill, and orderly progress of the Project.

2 INTERPRETATION

- 2.1 If there is any conflict or inconsistency between the Scope of Services Document and the provisions of this Professional Services Agreement, then the provisions of this Professional Services Agreement shall take precedence, unless the Parties specifically agree otherwise in writing.
- 2.2 This Agreement is divided into numbered Articles (e.g., this Article 2 is identified as "Interpretation").
 Articles are further divided into numbered Sections (e.g., this Section is Section 2.2).
- 2.3 In this Agreement:
 - (a) the singular includes the plural, and vice versa, unless the context requires otherwise;
 - (b) "including" means "including without limitation";
 - (c) references to "herein," "hereunder," "hereto," and similar terms refer to the Agreement as a whole, and not to any particular Article or Section of the Agreement; and
 - (d) all headings herein are for convenience only, and will not be used to interpret this Agreement.

3 AGREEMENT SCOPE

- This Agreement governs all Services BGC provides Consultant.
- 3.2 This Agreement remains effective and binding on the Parties until either Party terminates this Agreement by giving the required written notice to the other Party.

4 STANDARD OF CARE

- 4.1 BGC will endeavor to provide the Services in a manner consistent with the degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised by other members of BGC's profession currently practicing under similar circumstances.
- 4.2 No express, statutory, or implied warranty applies to the Services or any Deliverables. BGC expressly disclaims all statutory and implied warranties, including warranties of merchantability or fitness for purpose. BGC does not guarantee any particular result from the Services.

4.3 Any goods BGC provides Consultant are provided on an "as is" basis, with no express or implied warranty from BGC. Upon Consultant's request, BGC will make reasonable effort to transfer to Consultant any available warranty provided by the manufacturer of such goods.

5 COMPENSATION

- 5.1 Consultant agrees to pay BGC for the Services in accordance with BGC's billing rate schedule, which is either included in the Scope of Services Document or attached hereto as an exhibit. All charges are payable in U.S. Dollars (USD). BGC may increase its billing rates once per calendar year, effective upon thirty (30) days advance written notice to Consultant.
- 5.2 Notwithstanding Section 5.1, BGC's normal billing rate schedule contained herein does not apply to any Services BGC provides Consultant related to a Claim or dispute between Consultant and a Third Party (including expert witness Services and Services related to mediation, depositions, arbitration, or litigation). Unless the Parties agree otherwise in writing, Consultant shall pay BGC for such disputerelated Services at double the rates contained in BGC's normal billing rate schedule.
- 5.3 Consultant agrees to reimburse BGC for all expenses BGC incurs for the Services. BGC agrees to obtain Consultant's prior approval before incurring such expenses. BGC may only charge Consultant a markup on expenses with Consultant's prior written approval.
- 5.4 Consultant shall pay for any applicable sales tax, value-added tax (including GST and HST), withholding, and other transactional tax related to the Services. Such taxes are payable in addition to amounts charged at BGC's billing rates.
- 5.5 Consultant must pay BGC for each invoice within thirty (30) days after receiving the invoice, without any holdback or deduction. BGC may charge Consultant interest at the rate of 1.0% per month (12% per annum) on any past due amounts. Consultant must reimburse BGC for any costs (including reasonable legal fees) BGC incurs to collect past due amounts from Consultant. BGC may suspend the Services if payment from Consultant for any undisputed invoice is more than thirty (30) days past due.

6 SUB-CONSULTANTS/SUBCONTRACTORS

- 6.1 With Consultant's prior approval, BGC may engage sub-consultants or subcontractors to assist with the Services. Consultant shall pay BGC for all amounts billed to BGC by such sub-consultants and subcontractors. BGC may only charge Consultant a markup on subcontractor invoices with Consultant's prior written approval.
- 6.2 If any subcontractor or sub-consultant withdraws or is dismissed, then BGC may select a qualified replacement. Consultant may object to such proposed replacement within five (5) days after being advised of the replacement, whereupon BGC may select another replacement. If Consultant does not object within five (5) days of being advised of a replacement, the replacement will be deemed acceptable to Consultant.

7 RIGHT OF ENTRY AND PROJECT INFORMATION

- 7.1 Consultant shall permit, or obtain permission for, BGC Group to enter onto and pass over all properties to which access is necessary for the Services.
- 7.2 Consultant shall promptly provide BGC all available documents and information relevant to the Services. Unless the Parties agree otherwise in writing: (a) BGC is entitled to assume that all information and documents BGC receives from Consultant or Consultant's Personnel are accurate, complete, and reliable; and (b) BGC is not required to independently verify such information or documents. Consultant must immediately notify BGC if any such information changes or is discovered to be incomplete or unreliable.
- 7.3 BGC shall not be liable for any incorrect advice, judgment, or decision which is based, in whole or in part, on incomplete or inaccurate documents or information BGC receives from Consultant or Consultant's Designated Representative, who has been authorized to act on Consultant's behalf to perform daily management responsibilities and to bind Consultant. Consultant's Designated Representative shall be available at reasonable times during the term of the Project to coordinate provision of the Services, answer questions, and respond to problems or complaints. Consultant shall indemnify and hold harmless BGC Group from and against any Claim or Loss arising, in whole or in part, due to any use of inaccurate, incomplete, or unreliable documents or information BGC received from Consultant or Consultant's Designated Representative.
- 7.4 Except to the extent BGC agrees otherwise in the Scope of Services Document, Consultant must promptly arrange for the identification and marking of all utilities and subterranean structures on the Project site. BGC will not be responsible for damage to utilities or subterranean structures that are not called to BGC's attention, are incorrectly marked by Consultant or Consultant's Personnel, or are incorrectly shown on plans furnished to BGC. If any proposed work locations may interfere with underground facilities in BGC's opinion, BGC will notify the Consultant's Designated Representative and an alternative location or work method will be selected.

8 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY, DELIVERABLES, AND CHANGE ORDERS

8.1 Intellectual Property

- 8.1.1 BGC shall retain sole and exclusive ownership of all right, title, and interest (including all IP Rights) in and to all Intellectual Property that BGC creates, conceives of, or reduces to practice during or as a result of the Services. BGC also retains sole and exclusive ownership of all Intellectual Property (and all IP Rights thereto) that BGC: (a) created, owned, or conceived of before entering this Agreement; or (b) creates, conceives of, or acquires at any time independently of the Services.
- 8.1.2 BGC reserves the unrestricted right to utilize its Intellectual Property for any purpose.
- 8.1.3 In order for Consultant to use BGC's Intellectual Property, BGC may require Consultant to accept additional terms and pay a periodic fee. Unless the Parties later agree (or have already agreed) otherwise

in writing, all matters (including Claims and Losses) arising out of Consultant's use of or reliance upon BGC's Intellectual Property will be governed by this Agreement.

8.1.4 Unauthorized use, distribution, alteration, and sub-licensing of BGC's Intellectual Property are prohibited.

8.2 Deliverables

- 8.2.1 The Scope of Services Document identifies any Deliverable(s) BGC must provide Consultant as part of the Services. BGC is the sole owner of all Deliverables and Notes. BGC retains the copyright to all Deliverables and Notes. BGC is not required to provide Consultant any Notes.
- 8.2.2 Upon full and final payment of all BGC's invoices for the Services, BGC shall be deemed to have granted Consultant a perpetual license to use the Deliverables for their intended purpose for the Project.
- 8.2.3 Consultant may only use Deliverables for the specific purpose and Project for which BGC provides the Deliverables to Consultant. Consultant may also provide complete unaltered copies of Deliverables to governmental agencies in connection with Consultant's applications for permits or approvals for the Project.
- 8.2.4 Consultant shall indemnify and hold harmless BGC Group (and each of them) from and against any Claim or Loss resulting, in whole or in part, from any unauthorized use or modification of any Deliverable by Consultant or Consultant's Affiliates.
- 8.2.5 If BGC installs any objects, wells, or devices (collectively, "Installations") on the Project site, then BGC will notify Consultant of the approximate location of such Installation(s). Immediately after BGC delivers possession or control of any Installation to Consultant, Consultant will thereafter be solely responsible for the Installation, any required maintenance or removal of the Installation, and providing any required notices related to the Installation or its location. After BGC delivers possession or control of an Installation to Consultant, BGC will not be liable for any Claims or Losses thereafter arising out of either: (a) any contacts, collisions, or other interactions with the Installation; (b) failure to properly maintain the Installation; or (c) any requirement to monitor, identify, provide notice of, or remove the Installation. Consultant will indemnify BGC Group against all Claims and Losses described in the prior sentence.

8.3 Change Orders

- 8.3.1 Either Party may at any time propose to the other Party a change to the Services (a "Change"), including the addition, modification, or cancellation of Services.
- 8.3.2 If a proposed Change causes an increase or decrease in the schedule or cost of the Services, then the Parties shall negotiate a fair adjustment to the schedule for the Services, BGC's compensation, or both. After reaching agreement on such adjustment(s), the Parties will then execute a change order to amend the Scope of Services Document accordingly.

8.3.3 BGC is not authorized or required to proceed with any proposed Change until the Parties execute in writing a change order memorializing the agreed adjustments to BGC's scope of work, performance schedule, and compensation for the Change.

9 CONFIDENTIALITY

- 9.1 Except as permitted in this Agreement, neither Party may disclose or publish any of the other Party's Confidential Information. Each Party agrees to take reasonable measures to prevent the unauthorized disclosure of the other Party's Confidential Information.
- 9.2 A Receiving Party may only use the Disclosing Party's Confidential Information to the extent necessary for the Services or the Project.
- 9.3 A Receiving Party may share the Disclosing Party's Confidential Information with the Receiving Party's Personnel and contractors who need to know such information for the Services or the Project.
- 9.4 A Receiving Party may also disclose the Disclosing Party's Confidential Information to the extent necessary to comply with a binding court order or legal requirement. The Party compelled to make such disclosure must: (a) give the Disclosing Party prompt written notice of such disclosure requirement; (b) reasonably cooperate with the Disclosing Party in seeking a protective order or other appropriate relief; and (c) limit the disclosure to the minimum disclosure required.
- 9.5 BGC may also notify Third Parties of Project-related issues when BGC considers such disclosure necessary to prevent personal injury, Environmental Pollution, or property damage. No such notification will be considered a breach of this Agreement or a breach of the confidentiality requirements herein.
- 9.6 Upon the expiry or termination of this Agreement, the Receiving Party shall promptly return all the Disclosing Party's Confidential Information to the Disclosing Party, or confirm in writing that all documents in the Receiving Party's possession (whether paper, electronic, or in any other form) containing the Disclosing Party's Confidential Information have been destroyed. Notwithstanding the foregoing, BGC may retain confidential file copies of any information and documents BGC used, relied upon, or generated for the Services.
- 9.7 Each Party will require its Personnel and Affiliates to comply with this Article 9. A Party is responsible for any breach of this Article 9 by its Personnel or Affiliates.
- 9.8 Each Party is entitled to immediate injunctive relief to stop or prevent any violation of this Article 9. A Party seeking such relief is not required to prove actual damages, or post any bond.

10 INSURANCE

- 10.1 BGC agrees to carry the following insurance while providing Services:
 - a. coverage required by applicable Worker's Compensation legislation;
 - b. employer's liability insurance of One Million U.S. Dollars (\$1,000,000.00 USD);

- c. commercial general liability insurance, in the amount of Two Million U.S. Dollars (\$2,000,000.00 USD) per occurrence and in the aggregate; and
- d. professional liability insurance, in the amount of One Million U.S. Dollars (\$1,000,000.00 USD) per claim and in the aggregate.
- 10.2 Upon request, BGC will provide Consultant a certificate of insurance for the required insurance coverages.
 - a. BGC shall cause Consultant to be named as additional insured on the required commercial general liability insurance policy maintained by BGC r its Affiliates in respect of the Project.

11 LIMIT OF LIABILITY TO CONSULTANT

- 11.1 BGC Group's liability is limited to direct damages only.
- 11.2 BGC Group's total aggregate liability to Consultant for all Claims or Losses arising out of, resulting from, or related in any way to this Agreement, the Project, or the Services shall not exceed the greater of (i) a sum of money equal to the fees Consultant paid BGC for the applicable Services out of which the Claims or Losses arose, or (ii) TWO HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND U.S. DOLLARS (\$250,000.00 USD) (the "Liability Cap"). The Liability Cap applies:
 - to the fullest extent permitted by law;
 - notwithstanding anything else to the contrary in this Agreement; and
 - c. whether Claims or Losses arise in contract (including breach of contract), tort (including negligence or negligent misrepresentation), warranty, statute, strict liability, or any other theory of recovery or liability at law or in equity.
- 11.3 Consultant further agrees that the Liability Cap is binding on Consultant and Consultant's Affiliates. Any reference to "Consultant" in Section 11.2 above includes both the Consultant that entered this Agreement and any of its Affiliates that may bring one or more Claims against any of BGC Group related in any way to this Agreement, the Project, or the Services. For greater certainty, BGC Group's total aggregate liability to Consultant and Consultant's Affiliates for all Claims or Losses arising out of, resulting from, or related in any way to this Agreement, the Project, or the Services shall not exceed the Liability Cap.
- 11.4 Consultant represents and confirms that it has authority to bind its Affiliates to the Liability Cap.
- 11.5 If it is determined that Consultant lacks authority to bind any Affiliate of Consultant to the Liability Cap, then:
 - a. the Liability Cap will remain binding on Consultant and Consultant's other Affiliates.

12 LIMIT OF LIABILITY TO BGC GROUP

12.1 Notwithstanding any other provision to the contrary, Consultant's aggregate liability for all claims arising out of this Agreement, including any defense obligation, is limited to the greater of (i) a sum of money equal to the fees Consultant paid BGC for the applicable Services out of which the Claims or Losses arose, or (ii) \$250,000.

13 OTHER LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY AND INDEMNITIES

- 13.1 Claims Relating to Acts or Omissions of Consultant, Consultant's Affiliates, or Their Personnel
- 13.1.1 Consultant agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless BGC Group, and each of them, from and against any Claim or Loss arising, in whole or in part, out of:
 - a. the comparative negligent act or omission of Consultant, Consultant's Affiliates, or any of their respective Personnel; or
 - a decision or action by Consultant that is contrary to advice BGC previously communicated to any of them.

14 MUTUAL WAIVER

- All BGC Group members are entitled to enforce any provision of this Agreement that requires Consultant to limit or waive BGC Group's liability, or to indemnify BGC Group. BGC may also enforce such provisions on behalf of other BGC Group members. All of this Article 14 applies to the fullest extent permitted by law. In no event will either Party be liable to the other Party for any of the following kinds of losses or damages arising out of or resulting from this Agreement, the Services, or the Project: (a) punitive, exemplary, aggravated, incidental, special, indirect, or consequential damages; (b) loss of actual or anticipated profit, revenue, product, contract, production, business opportunity, goodwill, data, or property value; (c) costs of capital, financing, or overhead; or (d) business interruptions. The foregoing kinds of losses and damages for which a Party has no liability are referred to herein as "Waived Damages."
- 14.2 Additionally, each Party, for itself and as agent for its Affiliates, hereby releases the other Party, such other Party's Affiliates, and their respective Personnel from all liability for any Waived Damages that the releasing Party or its Affiliates may suffer as a result of or in connection with this Agreement, the Services, or the Project.
- 14.3 For greater certainty, this Article 14 does not apply to Consultant's obligation to pay BGC's invoices for Services.

15 TERMS FAIRLY NEGOTIATED

15.1 The Parties acknowledge that they negotiated the limitations of liability, agreements to defend, indemnities, and waivers set forth in this Agreement in consideration of the relative risks and benefits of the Services to each Party.

16 DEFICIENCIES REPORTING

- 16.1 Consultant shall promptly provide BGC written notice of any known or suspected deficiencies in the Services (a "Deficiency Notice"). Consultant's failure to do so may prejudice BGC's ability to properly investigate the cause of a deficiency, or to take effective measures to minimize the consequences thereof. If:
 - Consultant fails to provide BGC a Deficiency Notice within ten (10) days after becoming aware of a deficiency in the Services, and
 - such failure to provide a timely Deficiency Notice hinders BGC's ability to investigate, analyze, or correct the deficiency,

then Consultant shall be deemed to have waived and released all rights of action against BGC Group (or any of them) for Claims or Losses arising from the deficiency in the Services.

17 ENVIRONMENTAL

- 17.1 Unless otherwise specified in the Scope of Services Document, BGC's Services will not address, investigate, monitor, search for, evaluate, handle, or transport Environmental Pollution.
- 17.2 Special risks are associated with the identification of subsurface or underground conditions. Because such conditions are hidden, they cannot always be targeted in a subsurface exploration plan. Even a comprehensive sampling and testing program may not detect certain conditions. For similar reasons, conditions BGC infers to exist between sampling points may differ significantly from conditions that actually exist. Due to natural occurrences or human intervention, actual conditions are subject to rapid change. Consultant acknowledges that the risks identified in this Section cannot be eliminated.
- 17.3 Unless BGC agrees otherwise in writing, BGC is not the "prime contractor" of the Project site. BGC will take reasonable measures to protect the health and safety of its own Personnel, but BGC is not responsible for the health or safety of any other Person's Personnel.

18 HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

- 18.1 Consultant must immediately inform BGC if Consultant discovers or suspects that Environmental Poliution may exist at any place where BGC Group will provide Services or require access.
- 18.2 The discovery of Environmental Pollution on or near a worksite constitutes a changed condition. Consultant will pay BGC for any additional Services BGC provides, and any costs BGC reasonably incurs, because of Environmental Pollution on or near a worksite. If Environmental Pollution is discovered on or near a worksite, then: (a) BGC may suspend the Services until the problem is resolved to BGC's satisfaction, and (b) BGC is entitled to an equitable time extension to complete any delayed Services.

19 TERMINATION

- 19.1 Either Party may terminate this Agreement for convenience upon ten (10) days advance written notice to the other Party.
- 19.2 Either Party may terminate this Agreement for cause upon written notice to the other Party, if the other Party breaches any of its obligations under this Agreement and fails to cure such breach (or to commence diligent steps towards curing the breach) within five (5) days after receiving a written default notice.
- 19.3 Either Party may immediately terminate this Agreement upon written notice to the other Party if such other Party becomes insolvent, makes an assignment for the benefit of its creditors, enters into a plan for the benefit of its creditors, files a bankruptcy petition (either voluntarily or involuntarily), or takes the benefit of any insolvency or bankruptcy law.
- 19.4 After any termination of this Agreement, Consultant shall promptly pay BGC all undisputed amounts Consultant owes BGC, including: (a) all undisputed charges in BGC's unpaid invoices; (b) all expenses, previously authorized by Consultant, that BGC incurred or irrevocably committed to for the Services; and (c) all fees for Services provided but not yet invoiced.

20 ASSIGNMENT

20.1 Neither Party may assign this Agreement without the other Party's prior written consent. This Agreement inures to the benefit of, and is binding upon, the Parties and their respective administrators, successors, and assigns. Except as specifically provided in this Agreement, the provisions of this Agreement are for the exclusive benefit of the Parties, and no other Person shall be a third-party beneficiary or have any rights by virtue of this Agreement.

21 FORCE MAJEURE

21.1 Neither Party is in breach of this Agreement whenever such Party is unable to perform any of its obligations hereunder due to Force Majeure. Each Party must: (a) promptly notify the other Party of the Force Majeure, (b) take reasonable measures (if possible) to mitigate the consequences of Force Majeure, (c) continue performing any obligations that are not affected by Force Majeure, and (d) promptly resume performance after the Force Majeure ends. Upon both Parties' written agreement, BGC is entitled to an equitable time extension, and may be entitled to increased compensation as applicable, to complete any Services affected, suspended, or delayed due to Force Majeure.

22 NOTICES

22.1 Notices between the Parties must be in writing. Notices may be delivered by hand, courier, mail, facsimile, email, or other reasonable means. Any notice delivered after 4:30 P.M. Mountain Time or on a day other than a normal business day that is not a federal U.S. holiday will be deemed to have been received on the next normal business day after delivery. Notices sent by email or facsimile are ineffective if the sending Party receives a notice that the facsimile or email failed to send.

22.2 The Parties' addresses for notices are set forth on page one of this Agreement. Either Party may change its notice address by providing notice thereof to the other Party. Each Party shall designate a representative who is authorized to act on its behalf and to receive notices under this Agreement. Absent such designation, a Party's signatory to this Agreement is the Party's representative.

23 SURVIVAL

23.1 All indemnities herein, all limitations of BGC Group's liability herein, and any other provisions of this Agreement that by their nature are intended to survive the termination or expiration of this Agreement will remain in effect and will be enforceable following the expiry or any termination of this Agreement.

24 NO WAIVER

24.1 A Party's waiver of any breach of the other Party's obligations shall not be binding unless the waiver is in writing and signed by an authorized representative of the waiving Party.

25 GOVERNANCE

25.1 The construction, validity, interpretation, and performance of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the U.S.A. state in which the Project is located without regard to any conflict of laws principles. Any Claims (whether in contract, tort, statute, or otherwise) between the Parties arising out of or related to this Agreement or the Services shall be governed by the laws of the U.S.A. state in which the Project is located, without regard to any conflict of laws principles.

26 DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- 26.1 All Claims and disputes arising out of or related to this Agreement or the Services are subject to this Article 26.
- The Parties shall make reasonable, good faith efforts to resolve any demand or dispute between them by discussion and negotiation. The Parties will provide each other, on a "without prejudice" basis, frank, candid, and timely disclosure of relevant information and documents to facilitate those negotiations. The Parties shall promptly schedule a meeting between officers of each Party to negotiate the demand or dispute in good faith. If the Parties do not resolve a demand or dispute by negotiation within thirty (30) days after such meeting or within such other period agreed to by the Parties (the "Negotiation Period"), then, as a precondition to either Party commencing any legal action against the other, the Parties agree to attempt to resolve the demand or dispute through non-binding mediation in the U.S. state in which the Project is located. The mediation must occur within ninety (90) days after the expiry of the Negotiation Period or within such other period agreed to by the Parties. Each Party will pay half of the mediator's invoice for the mediation.
- 26.3 Any effort to resolve demands or disputes by negotiation or mediation will be conducted on a confidential basis and without prejudice to the Parties' rights or recourses.

- 26.4 If the Parties do not resolve a demand or dispute by negotiation or mediation within the time periods specified herein, then either Party may commence litigation in respect of the demand or dispute against the other Party in a state or federal court located in the U.S. state in which the Project is located. Each Party irrevocably submits to the exclusive jurisdiction of state and federal courts located in that U.S. state for all Claims arising out of or related to this Agreement or the Services, and each Party waives any right to object to any action arising out of or related to this Agreement or the Services being brought in such courts. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a Party may seek appropriate injunctive relief in any appropriate jurisdiction. When exigent circumstances exist, a Party may immediately seek appropriate interlocutory relief from any court in any appropriate jurisdiction without first attempting to negotiate a resolution with the other Party.
- 26.5 Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, each Party shall bear its own costs and legal fees associated with dispute resolution or litigation.

27 GENERAL

- 27.1 The invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability of any provision of this Agreement shall not affect the validity, legality, or enforceability of any other provision of this Agreement. If any provision of this Agreement is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, then such provision shall be limited or modified to the minimum extent necessary to make it valid and enforceable, and the provisions of this Agreement as so amended shall remain in full force and effect. If an invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision cannot be reformed to make it valid, legal, and enforceable, then:
 - such provision shall be stricken from this Agreement;
 - ii. the rest of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect and be construed without reference to the void or unenforceable provision; and
 - iii. the Parties shall negotiate in good faith to agree upon a valid and enforceable replacement provision that is as near as possible to the void or unenforceable provision's original intent.
- 27.2 The Parties agree to take such other actions, and to execute such additional documents, as may be necessary to fulfill the intent and purpose of this Agreement.
- 27.3 Both Parties' rights and remedies under this Agreement are cumulative.
- 27.4 This Agreement contains the Parties' entire agreement regarding the subject matter hereof. This Agreement supersedes all the Parties' prior understandings regarding the subject matter of this Agreement, whether written or oral. This Agreement may only be amended by a written document executed by both Parties.
- 27.5 Each Party had a full and fair opportunity to consult its legal counsel and negotiate the terms of this Agreement. The terms and provisions of this Agreement shall not be construed in favor of or against any Party merely because one Party prepared some or all of this Agreement. Any ambiguity in this Agreement shall not be construed strictly in favor of or against either Party.

27.6 This Agreement may be executed in separate counterparts, including via "wet ink" signature or electronically. All such counterparts taken together shall be deemed the same original instrument.

Legislative Report

2025 Session ☐ rap Up

The state legislature adjourned sine die in the early morning hours of Saturday, May 3, after 74 days. This leaves six days of the 80 days allotted by the state constitution every two years for policymakers to reconvene as needed during the interim. At adjournment, the state's budget was nearly □20.3 billion, an increase from the 2023-2025 budget of □19.6 billion.

A total of 1,035 bills were introduced and acted on this session, the most since the 2009 session, and the legislature passed approximately 600 of the introduced bills and resolutions. The governor has until May 23 to either sign or veto a bill. Although unusual, the legislature could reconvene to consider any vetoes that happen after adjournment.

When it comes to water, this was a very active session. We saw new tools rolled out to maximize Resources Trust Fund dollars while also advocating strongly to <u>retain the current</u> percentage of the oil extraction tax that funds the Resources Trust Fund.

On the policy side, there were 17 bills introduced that had a direct or indirect impact on Water Resource Districts and their operations. Of note, SB 2276 removes the requirement that all water resource districts join basin boards. Instead, the bill focuses on the development of project boards to facilitate project development and cooperation. Additionally, while B 1385 was not passed, the Department of Water Resources has committed to developing administrative rules establishing timelines for permit review for construction and drainage permits. Finally, some significant momentum was gained in the funding and policy surrounding construction and completion of drain projects. B 1020, for the first time, includes dedicated funds for conveyance projects. Additionally, the State Water Commission approved a cost share percentage of up to 60 on all drainage projects beginning uly 1. Finally, passage of B 1218 places a moratorium on the use of economic analysis for drain projects coming before the State Water Commission in the 2025-2027 biennium. All these pieces will make it much easier to work on projects in the coming biennium. We thank the State Water Commission, the Department of Water Resources and many legislative champions for their commitment to working on water resource district issues this session.

Irrigation saw similar wins. <u>B 1531</u> provides <u>75,000</u> for a study of the economic impact irrigation has on the state. The Irrigation Association is looking forward to working with a contractor starting this summer to complete that important study. Additionally, the Association will be working with the Department of Water Resources over the interim to tackle important issues like permitting and governance of irrigation districts.

As we look ahead to the 2025-2027 interim, there are several proposed studies surrounding water including a study of the economic analysis tool, a study of watershed districts and study of taxation of inundated lands. Additionally, $\Box B 1020$ calls for reviews of the finance and

governance of the large projects and the State Water Commission's cost share policy and expands the Water Topics Committee, particularly when it comes to oversight of new large, proposed projects.

Final Property Tax Relief and Reform □ill

□B 1176, the property tax relief and reform bill backed by Governor Armstrong, passed both chambers in the last hours of the legislature. A final agreement between the □ouse and Senate saw the Senate accept most of the House's preferred provisions. As passed, □B 1176 provides a □1,600 credit for primary residences modeled after the □500 credit passed in the last session. Like the existing primary residence credit, homeowners will have to apply for the credit. □omeowners will be eligible to receive a 100□ reduction in their tax up to □1,600. The funding for this credit is earnings off the Legacy Fund.
□B 1176 also applies a 3□ cap to most political subdivisions. There was much conversation about the impact of a cap on school districts. The final version does cap schools but also requires the state to make up the shortfall if the cap causes a school district to fall below the 60 mills the Century Code mandates. Of note, townships are not capped.
□B 1168 and □B 1575 were both defeated.

□egislative Management

Legislators elected <u>members</u> to the Legislative Management Committee. Legislative Management decides which discretionary studies to pursue during the interim, appoints interim committee members, and assigns studies to the interim committees. They will likely meet for the first time in Tune.

☐ OTUS Comments

The North Dakota Water Users Association joined the National Water Resources Association in <u>submitting comments on the new proposed Waters of the US (WOTUS) regulations</u>. □ighlights from the letter include fully implementing the Supreme Court's decision in the *Sackett* case and ensuring agriculture will not be negatively impacted.

Travnicek □**earing**

Dr. Travnicek's nomination hearing to be Assistant Secretary of the Interior for Water and Science was held on April 30. Dr. Travnicek was welcomed by Sen. □oeven and spoke of how her prior experience will assist her in her duties if confirmed. The hearing was recorded and can be <u>viewed on the committee's website</u>. The committee will likely vote on the nomination in the next few weeks.

□ ater Funding

□□ 1020 D□ R/S□ C Funding
□□ 1020 is the appropriations bill for the Department of Water Resources (DWR) and State

□B 1020 is the appropriations bill for the Department of Water Resources (DWR) and State Water Commission (SWC). A conferenced version of the bill was put together that authorized a line of credit up to □260 million line of credit. Of the □260 million line of credit, □50 million is

earmarked for the Southwest Pipeline Project's water treatment plant. The line of credit will allow large projects to better utilize state funding to complete their work.

The final version also included language to expand the responsibilities of the Water Topics Overview Committee. This committee has traditionally only met during the interim. The bill directs Water Topics to review new projects that would request ☐10M or more from the State Water Commission. If projects came up during the legislative session, the language allows the committee to meet during the legislative session.

Of note, the conferenced bill also removes the Water Stabilization Fund and allows the Department of Water Resources to hire an in-house attorney.

Different versions of the bill passed each chamber, so a conference committee was appointed. The conference committee met several times and agreed to the Senate version of the bill (requires a two-year moratorium on the EA for assessment projects and a study of the EA tool) with two additions. The bill now removes the State Water Commission's discretion to lower the threshold from \$1 million for assessment projects. The bill also changes the study of the EA from an agency study to a legislative study, likely conducted by the interim Water Topics Committee.
Delivered to the Governor May 1
□□ 1280 □ oting Rights for Nonpaying □ andowners Passed □ B 1280 would prohibit a landowner who has failed to pay an assessment from voting on a potential assessment project.
Signed by the Governor April 18
□□ 1385 Permit Deadlines for D□ R Failed □B 1385 establishes deadlines for processing construction and drainage permits from the Department of Water Resources. Additionally, the bill establishes deadlines for appeals heard by the department. The Department of Water Resources is working to establish a 120-day

permit deadline in administrative rule. All parties agreed to work through the administrative rules process. Because of this the bill failed.

Failed in the □ouse, consent, February 4

□□ 1396 Drainage by □andowners Opposed to Assessment Projects Failed □B 1396 would give the water resource district the ability to not approve drainage projects from landowners who opposed an assessment project for five years following the vote against the project.

Failed in the □ouse, 5-86, February 4

□□ 1544 Downstream Notification on Drainage Projects

Failed

□B 1544 reduces the threshold for a surface drainage permit from 80 acres of watershed to 0 if a surface drain flows directly onto another landowner without first obtaining written consent from the downstream landowner. It requires notice be provided to downstream landowners who are affected by any subsurface water management system (tile drain) under 80 acres. If the downstream landowner objects to the tile drain, the person seeking to install the tile drain must apply for a subsurface water management permit.

Failed in the □ouse, 27-63, February 17

□□ 1557 □egal Fee Reimbursement Grant

Failed

□B 1557 provides an appropriation to the Department of the Water Resources in the amount of \$221,993 "for the purpose of providing grants to reimburse residents for legal fees associated with watershed lawsuits heard by the North Dakota supreme court."

Failed in the □ouse, 6-85, February 4

S □ **2044** □ atercourse Determinations

Passed

SB 2044 would allow aggrieved persons, and not just water resource districts, the ability to appeal a watercourse determination to the Department of Water Resources. This bill was submitted by the Department of Water Resources. The Water Resource Districts Association testified in support of this bill.

Signed by the Governor March 18

S □ 2059 □ earing and Appeals of the Department of □ ater Resources

Passed

SB 2059 was requested by the Department of Water Resources. It makes updates to several pieces of code regarding hearings and appeals related to the department. Of note, it removes many instances of a 15-day deadline for response to a notice from the department. It also updates service of information from the department be made via certified mail.

Signed by the Governor March 18

S□ 2069 Publication Requirements

Passed

SB 2069 is a bill requested by the Public Service Commission that would have initially required all units of government to file any notice that is required to be published in a newspaper with the Secretary of State as well. The bill was amended to only apply to state agencies after feedback from the Water Resource Districts Association.

Signed by the Governor April 23

S□ 2118 Stream Crossing Determinations

Failed

SB 2118 is a bill requested by the Department of Water Resources that removes the department from the process of providing stream crossing determinations. The Water Resource Districts Association offered alternative language that gives water resource districts the authority to establish a stream crossing determination and allows the Agriculture Commissioner to consult with state agencies when there is a disagreement. The Department of Water Resources agreed to work with water resource districts over the next interim on this issue. The DWR also agreed to look at contracting out these determinations so they can be done in a more timely manner.

Failed in the Senate, 0-47, □anuary 20

S□ 2180 Public Comment at Public Meetings

Passed

SB 2180 requires certain public entities, including water resource districts, allocate time for public comment on the agenda of all meetings. The public entity can set the time allowed for public comment, the time each speaker can speak, as well as limit comments to relevant topics. The public entity is required to develop a policy regarding public comment. If passed, all water resource districts would be required to comply with SB 2180.

Signed by the Governor May 1

S 2153 Clean Up □ill

Passed

SB 2153 is a bill that cleans up an error in existing statute regarding conveyance projects.

SB 2210 would authorize a legislative management study to look at water management from a watershed perspective. The bill passed unanimously out of the Senate committee and passed the Senate 45-2.

Passed

SB 2276 is an update to the joint board bill that passed last session. This bill was significantly amended in conjunction with the Water Resource Districts Association, the Association of Counties and legislators. The bill, as passed, repeals current and proposed mandates to join large basin or watershed boards. The bill instead mandates participation in a project board if there is an assessment project that spans multiple counties. The amendment also clarifies the process for levying assessments across county lines.

S 2283 Small Subsurface Drainage Requirements

Failed

SB 2283 requires that notice be served on downstream landowners when a landowner installs a drainage project under 80 acres. The notice must be served via certified mail. The downstream landowners then have 30 days to deliver written objections to the water board on the project. If there are objections, the water board can then place conditions on the permit like they can for large drainage projects. Damages sustained by drainage have to be mediated by a board appointed by the water board. Mediation is nonbinding and costs are borne by the owner of the drainage system. There was lots of opposition testimony from ag groups.

Passed

SB 2020 is the funding bill for NDSU research and extension. The final version of the bill includes a 3 merit-based pay raise in each year of the biennium for all agencies within the appropriations bill. The NDSU Extension budget received a general fund base budget decrease of $\Box 681,457$ (a 2.1 cut) but does include funding for a carbon and biofuels specialist, to help farmers and ranchers improve their profitability through better business decisions related to carbon contracts. The branch research center budget received an additional $\Box 280,000$ in operating support and $\Box 100,000$ toward a position related to grape research at the North Central Research Extension Center (REC) in Minot. The main research center budget (North Dakota Agriculture Experiment Station $\Box NDAES \Box$) received a general fund base budget decrease of $\Box 639,262$ (a 1.1 \Box cut) and a removal of 4.98 FTE and the associated budget ($\Box 1,140,411$) for

positions vacant for 24 months or more. While there were cuts to the budget, the main research center budget did see some positive outcomes. The bill includes additional funding for an FTE veterinary toxicology resident position, an added $_500,000$ in one-time funds for deferred maintenance, $_620,000$ for the completion of the research building at the Oakes Irrigation Research Site, and $_950,000$ in state funding and $_1.65$ million in fundraising authorization for the seed conditioning plant at the Langdon REC. It also adds $_400,000$ in state funding, plus an additional $_1.9$ million in fundraising authorization, for the Nesson $_alley$ facility at the Williston REC. The Williston REC also received $_200,000$ in fundraising authority to complete its machine shed project. It also includes $_1.5675$ million for the construction of pre-engineered steel machinery storage buildings at the Dickinson, Central Grasslands, and Carrington RECs. Lastly, the bill adds an emergency clause to start renovations on the entirely privately funded NDSU Swine Research Unit.



 - II. Have a display that is readable at all times, whether the system is operating or not.
 - III. Have a totalizer that meets the following criteria:
 - a. Is continuously updated to read directly only in acre-feet, acre-inches, gallons, cubic feet, or barrels (42 U.S. gallons),
 - b. Has sufficient capacity, without cycling past zero more than once each year, to record the water quantity diverted in any one calendar year,
 - c. Has a dial or counter that can be timed with a stopwatch over not more than a 10-minute period to accurately determine the flow rate under normal operating conditions, and
 - d. Has a nonvolatile memory if the meter is equipped with an electronic totalizer.
 - IV. Be installed according to manufacturer's specifications and must be properly maintained according to manufacturer's recommendations including proper winterization such as removal during the winter.
